Executive Board Meeting, February 25, 2012

Winetrout #4

The meeting was called to order by President Don Davis. A quorum was present, including 2nd Vice-President Jeanette McCarthy on the phone from Spokane. The minutes of the previous Executive Board meeting were read and approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> Treas. Rhonda Davis presented her report as follows:

Committee Reports

<u>Junior Promotion</u> Phyl Quist reported that the money, about \$3900 in the fund, is adequate to cover our Juniors to the World this year.

<u>Promotion</u> Phyl Quist reported for Chairman Jon Turnbull that he is considering a non-sanctioned tournament in Chelan to get more interest going in that area.

<u>By-Laws Committee</u> Rhonda reported that she, Phyl Quist, and Monty McLaughlin had developed the proposal for the by-laws for the State Doubles Tournament. She distributed copies and read the proposal.

It was discussed and Vic Magnus suggested that this proposal be posted on the state website with the announcement that this will be voted on at the next General Meeting. Rhonda agreed to do this. (Vic also commented that the website is looking very good.)

Old Business

<u>Humidifier for the Trailer</u> Phyl Quist reported that Dick Lovgren donated a humidifier and it is working just great. Thanks have been sent out to him for this awesome donation.

New Business

<u>Plaques</u> Phyl explained that the costs of plaques is down because of the adoption of the plan for individuals paying for their plaques beyond the first one. At present the club sends in \$6 for each plate. Phyl moved to reduce the \$6 fee to \$5. The motion was seconded and passed.

<u>Everett Tournaments</u> John Alexander reported that there will be no other tournaments in Everett this year after the Winetrouts. <u>Scorekeepers</u> Phyl discussed the fact that everyone who wants to keep score should be able to do it. When there is a shortage of scorekeepers it is helpful if some keep more than one score, and we appreciate that. However, when we have enough scorekeepers, make sure that everyone who wants to keep score has a chance to do it. It's something to be aware of.








World Tournament The deadline for the World Tournament in Knoxville, Tennessee, is May 17. The fee this year is \$130, which includes a \$5 fee to cover the cost of more units for electronic scorekeeping. All scores will be kept electronically this year. NHPA Raffle: This is to raise money for the scorekeeping machines and the Hall of Fame. Tickets are \$5 or 5 for \$25. Phyl will take

money for these tickets and send it to Casey Sluys. The main award is a nice package: Free entry to the World Tournament, a week's stay at a motel, \$100 in merchandise, and more. It is a \$1500 package. In addition there will be four other prizes for 2nd to 5th places.

<u>Club Officers</u> The secretary distributed reminders for each club to send her information about their officers for 2012, and for Tournament Directors to send cell phone numbers that could be used for emergencies at tournaments.

Membership Rhonda reported that the membership forms have been updated. She also explained that she can start selling memberships for the next year on October 1.

Any new member who wants to pitch after that can pay for the next year and play through the current year.

Email List Regional Director Vic Magnus is putting together a list of members' emails for an NHPA listing. Rhonda says that the membership form now has a space for email addresses, and she will pass those on to Vic.

Shoes News Rhonda reminded the clubs that the ads for 2012 are due. She also mentioned that we need to support the businesses that advertise with us. Pres. Don suggests you let them know where you're from and why you're there.

Everett Facility Expenses The park department is asking a lot of money for the use of the building - \$3300 for 6 tournaments. Pres. Don wonders if we could rent a pavilion next year and try it out to see how cumbersome it would be. The rental on a pavilion is \$50 per use. We might be able to park a motor home near the courts for statistician use. We will talk more about this later. Meeting was adjourned.

PLATES & PLAQUE PROGRAM

The Executive Board has made some changes to our plate and plaque program. Retroactive to January 2012, every person who qualifies for their first WSHPA plaque will be presented with that award at the State Tournament of each year. Any plaques earned after the first one will now be available at a cost of \$25. (This does not pertain to Juniors.)

You earn your first plaque after having earned 5 plates. Plates will continue to be awarded as they presently are:

4 person class
5-6 person class
7-8 person class
9-10 person class

- 1st place plate
- 1st & 2nd place plates
- 1st, 2nd & 3rd place plates
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th place plates

You can opt to receive \$3.00 per plate instead of the plate. However, I must be notified of this option early in the season before I start ordering plates. Once a person has chosen this option it will be permanent. The only exception is our State Singles and State Doubles Tournaments. These plates are all ordered and distributed.

TD & CLUB TREAS. - PLEASE NOTE: The cost of plates for your tournament has been reduced from \$6.00 to \$5.00 per plate. Please submit that new amount to Rhonda along with your other tournament fees.

age or older before the end of 2012. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2012 or is older or physically impaired person of any age may enter the ELDER MEN'S DIVISION. Provided they meet the requirements listed above. JUNIOR DIVISION entrants must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2012 calendar year. Note # 1. A Social Security number is required from all adult pitchers that move up to the Championship Classes.

You may enter at anytime prior to May 17th. All adult averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS/CANSTATS on May

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of
