

many times. Last year a large number of Canadians came down to join in the fun at the Bellingham International in August. Let's respond in kind by having a good number of our pitchers going the short distance over the northern border to pitch in the BC International Highwayman Open in Appotsford.

Hollis Morris called me the other day to tell me that one of Shoes News great sponsors, the Clover Island Inn in Kennewick had renewed their sponsorship for 2016. That was great news! My fellow pitchers, we in the WSHPA are blessed to have some very loyal sponsors to the Shoes News. Let's keep this great partnership going by supporting them often.

Many of you have been wondering about my health, let me give you a little update on where I am at right now. On my last CT scan, they found bladder cancer had spread to my lungs, but the cancer nodules were very very small. They did a lung biopsy to confirm that they were cancer, and that came out positive. Up until this point all my treatment has been done at Smokey Point or Skagit Cancer Care Center in Mt. Vernon. Susan and I met with my oncologist and he suggested that I have a meeting with a doctor from the Seattle Cancer Care Alliance. He is a doctor that has programs that are for a limited amount of patients for a certain period of time, but the patient must be at a certain level of health and meet certain criteria to be eligible for the program. One of those criteria is that the nodules in the lungs have to be a certain size, if they are not then you have to wait until they grow, or go on to a different program. I recently had another CT Scan and am going to be visiting with my doctor to go over the results. We will check and see if the nodules have grown to the minimum size. If we go ahead with this program, I will be traveling to Seattle from Camano Island, I hope no more than once a week, for treatments. That will be pretty tiring for me, as I will be spending most of the day there and then a long ride home, about 100 miles round trip. The type of chemo that this program calls for is more pinpointed to the problem cells so it should be a little easier to take, at least that's what I'm hoping. What we are hoping is that the treatment will stop or slow way down the cell growth, and buy myself more time. I listen to all they tell me, but I know I have two mighty weapons they don't know about, they are the Great Physician and my team of prayer warriors. When God is your heavenly Father there are no limits on what is possible, and things can change in the blink of a eye. That alone fills me with great hope. I will walk by faith, not by sight, and my final prognosis is what my Lord says it is.





# Some Thoughts from One of the Greats... Henry Knauft

If someone knowledgeable about the WSHPA and it's history were to construct a "Mount Rushmore" to the greatest men's horseshoe pitchers in our state's history, there could be some debate about the numbers three and four on the monument, but as to who the first and second persons are there would be no debate. John Monasmith from Yakima won 15 Men's Singles Championships from 1949—1968. Henry Knauft of Spokane also won 15 Men's Singles Championships from 1966—1993. John Monasmith passed away on April 30th, 1998 at the age of 81.

Henry Knauft still resides in Spo-

kane, is in his early 90's, and earlier this year, I decided to write a letter to him asking him to share some thoughts with us about his distinguished career and any other words of wisdom he would like to impart to our generation about the game. After I sent the letter, I thought, oh no, what if I can't read his writing? My fears were totally unfounded, Henry has outstanding penmanship and his return letter was a joy for me to read.

He shared with me that since his wife passed away, horseshoes have kind of been put on the back burner. He hasn't stayed in as much contact with the NHPA since the Newsline Magazine was taken out of print and put online. He said he doesn't see much of a change in the future for the game. It has taken a few steps backward, competitively from what is was twenty or more years ago. Here are some of the thoughts Henry shared with us.

Two words that should fit in to your horseshoe pitching game are **dedication** and **desire**. In my early years, I was dedicated to the game, and then got the desire to do better. I knew that after my first state tournament, that 59% wasn't good enough to win many games in the championship class, so practice I did, but it was a slow climb to get to a 70% average.



I tried changing my pitch in all areas, and tried different horseshoes, finally settling on the Lee Shoe with a one and a quarter turn. Eighty percent was my goal.

This is important, no one can tell you how to pitch. We can only give you advice on what

might help. We are all built differently, so what works for one, may not help another.

Your stance, step, back swing, and follow through should be put together in one fluid motion.

In closing his letter, Henry mentioned that he was proud of his 15 State Titles, 10 Northwest Open Titles, and a 3rd and 4th place finish at the World Tournament, but didn't like to elaborate on them, because that's past history now.

Henry, thanks so much for sharing with our Shoes News readers some of your thoughts on the great game of horseshoes from someone who pitched during this "Golden Age" in the history of the game.


Not only can you tell at a glance that it is "horseshoe pitching," you can also see male and female participation, the association name




