orld Horseshoe Champions have been named for 2008. Alan Francis held off all challengers once again, repeating a beguiling performance where number 1&2 seeds in the championship class held off all challengers until the final game. Alan beat Brian Simmons in the final match 42-16 with a 89.3% game. In the 20 person championship rounds, Francis pitched two perfect games. He finished with an 89.3% average.

Sue Snyder and Canada's Sylvianne Moison worked their way through the 19 game women's round robin pitching to a 18/1 tie. Sue won the tie breaker 44/33 pitching 124 shoes with 110 ringers setting world records along the way.

Matt Fuller put on an impressive performance, finishing 2nd in the preliminaries, which earned him a second place seed in the championship class. In the championship class, Matt won his first 8 games impressively, pitching 27 ringers in one 30 shoe game for an average of 90%. A disappointing loss in the ninth game moved Matt into a tie with Michael Bowman who had also lost one game. He lost the next game to Michael, 36/41 in a 90 shoe game pitching 68 ringers for 75.6%. Those two losses dealt the championship to Michael who finished 10/1. Matt pitched the highest average in the championship rounds finishing @ 73.93%.

In class play Paul Quam and Gene Kuiken just missed being in the money placing 7th., as did Art Sperber finishing 6th. in a 14 person class. No other WA players brought home a paycheck from the 2008 World Tournament.

Next year's World Tournament will be held in Springfield IL. The delegates at the convention awarded Cedar Rapids, IA the 2010 World Tournament.





One-on-one with Cy Kitchen (July 2008)

This one on one interview is with the oldest active Washington State horseshoe pitcher, Cy Kitchen. At a spry 94 years young, he pitches a turn and ¾ shoe.

He took up horseshoes in 1975. He took Amy to a doctor appointment near Wright Park in Tacoma. While he was waiting, he took a walk around the park. He saw some guys pitching horseshoes, one of them was Bill Foss. They had a spare pair of shoes and invited him to pitch. That is where it began. They had him pitch one hundred shoes and he qualified at 32 %. He pitches that next weekend in a tournament!!

Cy started pitching Diamond tournaments, now he pitches with Ted Allen horseshoes.

His most memorable game was against Phyl Quist. He pitched a 60% against her, which was way over his average of 35%. Phyllis still reminds him of this game –

Advice Cy would give to beginning pitchers is: Focus on the stake and keep you mind on horseshoes.

He has been to one World Tournament, which was in California. He did not have too many wins, but he had a good time.

Cy and Amy were married in 1934. They have four children: Donny, Edie, Bill and Ed. Something you may not know about Cy:

Cy and Amy used to ride a Harley Davidson motorcycle together. Their Tacoma Club was called the Yellow jackets.

They once rode in the Portland Rose Parade.

After his retirement, he took on a mechanic job for about 3 years for pocket money.

Cy still enjoys pitching today. He believes that this is the best past time he has found. He loves to play horseshoes. He has been known to skip parties, funerals, and weddings just to pitch in a tournament.

Cy, you are in inspiration to our horseshoe family!






