



The Best Fitcher You Can Be

Are you still striving to be the very best pitcher you can be, or has a little bit of apathy or complacency taken up residence in the back of your mind? This can happen, especially if you are winning, or even placing in your present class just often enough to keep you a happy camper. It's a little bit of our human nature taking over. We get an idea of how good a pitcher we are, and when we reach that preconceived notion, our minds kind of semi-consciously tell us, you've arrived. At this point, we can sometimes settle in, and we stop putting in the time, effort, and drive it takes to get to the next level.

Of course there are a few things that can sometimes hold us back, some of these are age, injuries, or illness, but I also believe there are a few other factors that will eventually determine just how good a pitcher we will become. The first is a pretty obvious one. Do we have the drive within us to want to practice our craft regularly? This takes a certain outlay of time that many of us either can't do, or don't want to do. Another aspect of practice, is to practice smartly. What do I mean by that? Work on those parts of our games that give us trouble during tournaments. At times during a tournament, you have to pitch high on the stake, or go in low to get around an opponents leaning shoe. Another thing that can determine just how good a pitcher we will become, is our willingness to make slight adjustments when they are needed. This may include a slight grip adjustment, or a slight change in our foot placement or where we are standing on the pitching platform. Another thing, and this is important. There is absolutely nothing that prepares a pitcher better for pressure situations than pitching in tournaments. As you pitch in more and more tournaments, you become a lot more accustomed to making pitches in pressure situations which helps build confidence in your ability to come through in clutch situations more and more often. Pitching in sanctioned tournaments regularly is a huge part of improving as a pitcher.

There is another factor in how good a pitcher we will become, and that is natural ability. Some people are just naturally blessed with great hand/eye coordination, timing, rhythm, call it what you will, but they just pick up certain skills easier, faster, and better than the rest of us. That goes for people in all sports, and ours is no exception. Oh, don't get me wrong, these people still have to work at their games as well, and without a drive to succeed and excel they too will level out, and not become what they could have. Even natural ability will only take you so far if there is no burning desire within.

In conclusion, let's not settle for the pitcher we are, but keep pushing to be the pitcher we can become. If you are a 10% pitcher, shoot for 20%, if you are a 20% pitcher, go for 30%. If you are a 30% pitcher, push on to get to 40%. Keep climbing. Don't put any limits on how high you can climb. There may be an A Class pitcher inside you. Our game needs more A Class pitchers.

OHPA President, Ken Gilbert wrote an article in the June Ringer Review titled "Where Have All the High Percentage Pitchers Gone?" To excerpt some of what he said; "I wish we had more pitchers in the high average range, but we just don't have many. I personally think we should protect the integrity of what an 'A' pitcher means or a 'B 'or a 'C', etc. I want to be an Oregon A Class State Champion some day, but if that means that I'm pitching 30% and end up in the A Class, I will not feel good about that. To me 30% is not an A Class level and shouldn't be considered an A Class level, just because the quality of percentages in our state has dropped." Well said, Ken. *Jerry Clark*


