Commentary: *Jim Link*

With a few more changes, the 2009 Schedule is settled. Tacoma withdrew its tournaments having lost their courts at Wright Park. That Tacoma was one of the oldest clubs in the state marks a moment in the history of our sport that causes reflection but what kind of a statement it makes regarding the health of our sport begs more questions than provides answers. That clubs spring up in rural communities as we lose those in cities provokes thoughts about demographic change that promoters of our sport must consider.

The WSHPA as well as every other charter gains clubs and loses clubs. How the future looks for horseshoe pitching depends on what members of horseshoe pitching community want it to be. I'm reminded of a pithy comment by a colleague years ago. *'If they want it different they'll change it'*. What our sport will look like in the future depends on what our leaders do or don't do today.

Of course the vitality of any organization depends on the health of its treasury. It's time to renew your membership, your subscription to Shoes News, and your clubs ad in the newsletter. A business card size ad like most of the ads in Shoes News costs \$40 per year. That buys your club a special mention of your tournaments in the newsletter. **(Club secretaries...call, write, or email the editor with your special information.)** Renewing early will keep the newsletter coming to your mailbox. Ads and subscriptions expire with the March issue also. If you have not renewed you will not get the April issue.

Can Horseshoes attract a National Sponsor?

Each year at the Annual Meeting of the NHPA convention the topic that most concerns the delegates is how to promote our game. Hours are spent in forwarding new ideas. Individuals from across the country have local successes, but if a bold approach to attract a national sponsor has been tried, obviously it didn't meet with success.

There are many good reasons for a successful multinational organization to support horseshoe pitching. That there is a horseshoe pitching culture is demonstrated in the picture above. The farmstead, the 50's era John Deere tractor, and the Buick automobile speak of an America where horseshoe pitching was part of what we are about.

Those of us who are avid pitchers and supporters of our game, need to put some serious energy into organizing a marketing program, targeting John Deere as a national sponsor.

The golfing community has been successful in recruiting both John Deere and Buick to support golfing. An organizational effort with the right kind of approach can be successful in landing sponsorship with the right kind of approach.

NHPF FUND GRANTS IN 2008

Three Clubs receive grants in 2008

The NHPF Directors have approved a \$1,000 grant which has been sent to the President of the Moore, Oklahoma, Horseshoe Pitching Club. This club recently received approval from the Moore Parks & Rec Board to install 8 new courts in Fairmoore Park. The NHPF is happy to assist the club and city in this endeavor. It is understood that construction will start in the very near future.

Two more clubs have been approved to receive grants from the NHPF in 2008. The Dan Patch Horseshoe Club in Savage, Minnesota and the new Little Elm Horseshoe Club in Little Elm Texas have been sent checks to assist horseshoe court building projects in their City parks.

The deadline for the next review period is March 1, 2009."



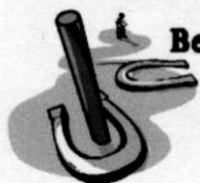

On page 6 Phyl tells a lady gambler story. Until one becomes part of our "horseshoe family" the depth of our appreciation for one another is hard to quantify. Phyl's condition was one that could have been fatal. Blood clots that originate in the lower extremities and migrate are very serious. That it happened while she was away from her regular health care providers had to be a very scary proposition. The 'rest of the story' where it became necessary that Jim fly to Reno, and then rent a car to drive her back to Bellingham, is just one more in a series of travel adventures for the Quists. It's not out of the ordinary for these two to cover 2000 miles on a weekend adventure. So Phyl, if you'd make your adventures a little less adventuresome, we'd all appreciate it.

Once again our prayers have been answered as she recovers. The Oxygen tanks that were part of her treatment are becoming fewer and fewer. She has returned to work, and the annual trip to Hawaii is once again being considered.

As the sun climbs higher in the sky each day, it's good to once again to be writing about Horseshoe Pitching. I'm ready. And as that sun energizes all of us we need to use that energy to promote our sport. For too long we've shrunk from the task of finding a national sponsor for the sport of horseshoe pitching. As I sit in my living room writing on my laptop, on the wall is a painting by a well known Midwestern artist 'Dave Barnhouse'. In a poor photo of it on page one is a family pitching horseshoes in a farmyard. There is a John Deere tractor in the background. Horseshoe Pitchers and the people who use John Deere's products come from a rural culture that use John Deere Tractors.

A few years ago I approached John Deere at their national headquarters in Moline, IL in a quest for a national sponsorship. I have a letter of rejection from someone in that office building whose job it is to reject those kinds of requests. If we can make a presentation to the President of that company, I have a notion that the response would be much different.

Isn't it reasonable to assume that if Alan Francis were able to pick up a check for \$250,000 when he wins the 2010 World horseshoe pitching tournament, in not too many years there would be courts in every community in America? And if we could walk into a John Deere dealership to buy our horseshoes and horseshoe related items, wouldn't it follow that if we were going to buy a new riding lawnmower that we would go to that same dealership to get it?

So this year folks we need to get our message out. Horseshoes is a family sport. Horseshoe pitchers live in every community in America. If it's worth \$5 million to have your name on a football stadium what is it worth to John Deere to have their banner hanging on the fence at every tournament in the country?

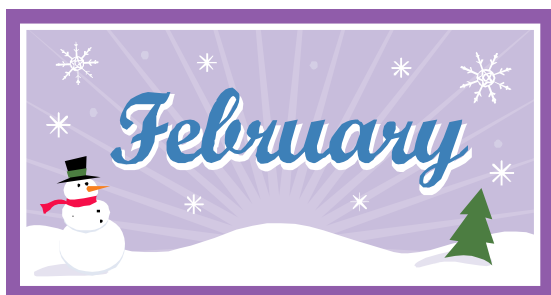
