






Welcome to 2010!

HALL OF FAME

HF-I: COMMITTEE, TERMS OF OFFICE, APPOINTMENTS

- A. A Hall of Fame Induction committee shall be comprised of five (5) members appointed by the President.
- B. In the event of death, resignation or removal from the committee of any member, the President shall appoint a new committee member to fill the unexpired term.
- C. Each member of the committee shall serve a five (5) year term, with one (1) members term of office expiring each year.
- D. The Hall of Fame Induction committee member with the greatest tenure shall be the Chairperson of the committee.
- E. There shall be a minimum of one (1) male and one (1) female on the Hall of Fame Induction committee at all times. (continued on Pages 6, 8.)

LIFE IN THE 1500'S

The next time you are washing your hands and complain because the water temperature isn't just how you like it, think about how things used to be. Here are some facts about the 1500's.

Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May and still smelled pretty good by June. However, they were starting to smell, so brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the body odor. Hence the custom today of carrying a bouquet when getting married.

Baths consisted of a big tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean water, then all the other sons and men, then the women and then the children. Last of all the babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence the saying, "Don't throw the baby out with the bath water".

Houses had thatched roofs – thick straw piled high, with no wood underneath. It was the only place for animals to get warm so all the cats and other small animals (mice, bugs) lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip and fall off the roof. Hence the saying, "It's raining cats and dogs". There was nothing to stop things from falling into the house. This posed a real problem in the bedroom where bugs and other droppings could mess up your nice clean bed. Hence a bed with big posts and a sheet hung over the top afforded some protection. That's how canopy beds came into existence.

The floor was dirt. Only the wealthy had something other than dirt. Hence the saying, "Dirt poor". The wealthy had slate floors that would get slippery in the winter when wet. So they spread thresh straw on the floor to help keep their footing. As the winter wore on they added more thresh until, when you opened the door, it would all start slipping outside. A piece of wood was placed in the entranceway. Hence the word "threshold".

In those old days, they cooked in the kitchen with a big kettle that always hung over the fire. Every day they lit the fire and added things to the pot. They ate mostly vegetables and did not get much meat. They would eat the stew for dinner, leaving leftovers in the pot to get cold overnight and then start over the next day. Sometimes stew had food in it that had been there for quite a while. Hence the rhyme "Pease porridge hot, pease porridge cold, pease porridge in the pot nine days old".

(Getting quite an education aren't you?) Bob Champion assures me that all the forgoing facts are absolutely true!



HOF Procedures

HF-II: PROCEDURES

- A. The name of nominees submitted as candidates for induction into the Hall of Fame must be submitted to the WSHPA Hall of Fame Induction Committee Chairperson by the member recommending induction of the nominee.
- B. The Hall of Fame Induction Committee Chairperson shall report the names of all nominees for induction to the Hall of Fame committee.
- C. A compilation of qualifications detailing the history of the candidates activity in horseshoes, etc. must be submitted to the Hall of Fame Chairperson at the time of nomination.
- D. All nominations must be submitted to the Hall of Fame Induction Committee Chairperson by considered during the current calendar year.
- E. The of Hall of Fame Induction Committee Chairperson shall submit copies of all candidates qualifications to each committee member prior to June 1.
- F. Hall of Fame Induction Committee persons must abstain from voting on Hall of Fame candidates that are members of their immediate family.



NEWS AND RINGER REVIEWS – JANUARY 1966

From Phyl Quist's archives

Washington State's first annual winter series horseshoe tournament, known as th "WINTER OPEN CLASSIC", got underway Sunday, January 9, 1966 at Seattle's Woodland Park Courts. 20 enthusiastic pitchers from 8 localities around the State participated in 3 classes and enjoyed the beautiful sunshine and mild weather.

Forest Reed, President of the Yakima Horseshoe Club, and his wife deserve special recognition for having come the farthest (160 miles through a snow storm in the mountains) to participate in the opener. Here's a real enthusiastic pitcher who goes all out to promote the sport. How about that!

This winter Tournament to be played in a series every other Sunday until May 15th, is scheduled at this time of the year to induce pitchers to become State & National members before the spring and summer tournaments come along. Each pitcher must have obtained a State & National card at a cost of \$2.00 before playing in his first session. An additional \$1.00 entry fee at each session entitles him to play for the trophy given at each session and a wall plaque that is competed for annually for 10 years. Any out of state pitchers are welcome but must have a S & N membership card and pay the \$1.00 for the cost of each Sunday's trophy. The pitcher who wins the most tournaments in his class at the conclusion of the winter series is awarded a plaque with his name and year inscribed on it. He keeps possession of this until tournament play resumes the following winter, at which time the plaque is returned to a State Horseshoe official to be displayed for further competition.

Francis Winetrout provided the 4 trophies and 4 wall plaques to get this tournament underway.

HF-III: GUIDELINES


HOF Guidlines

- Guidelines suggested for the Hall of Fame Induction Committee to follow are: A.
 - Voting on nominees by the committee shall be by secret ballot giving three (3) points for first, two (2) points for second, and one (1) point for third. A nominee selection will require twelve (12) points.
 - Points to consider, not listed in order of importance, would be:
 - Participation, Including length of time
- Promotion

Sportsmanship

- Ability
- When a person is selected as a candidate, but does not receive the required twelve (12) votes to be inducted, the B. name will remain on the ballot for the following year. If at that voting, he or she still does not receive enough votes, the candidate qualifications would have to be presented again at a later date.
- SPECIAL NOTE: The Hall of Fame committee should be resolved that induction into the Horseshoe Hall of Fame is a very special honor, and as such, the criteria for approval of nominees by the Hall of Fame committee should be maintained at a high level to assure that this honor is bestowed only on those who have significantly contributed to the sport of horseshoe pitching.


