





HALVERS AND HAVER NOT

Dick Sather of **Kennewick** returned from snowbird winter headquarters with a new tournament format played in the land of winter sunshine. The format is simple and sounds like a lot of fun.

Classes are 8 man, Seeding into the eight man class is random, accomplished by drawing numbers. Round robin play. Cancellation scoring. Opponents keep their own score but don't bother with ringer count so all they have to keep track of is the score which can be done without score sheets. Games can be to 21, 25, 40 or whatever you agree on and have time for, but 21 is suggested.

"Entry fee" is \$6.40, except each player pays his entry fee in a common pool and the amount is written on a card which he "totes" with him. After the first games the loser must pay the winner one half what he is "toting," (\$3.20). The winners each have \$9.60 to "tote" and the losers \$3.20 to "tote" into game 2.

Play game 2 of the round robin. Again the losers of the game must pay the winner one half of his "tote" (either \$4.80 or \$1.60, depending on how they fared during game one. The amounts are added to each of the winners "tote" and subtracted from the losers "tote" and off you go to game three.

The same format continues, with the winner of each game getting one half of their opponents "tote", until the round robin is completed. If you win every game you can end up with a good start on a retirement plan. If you lose all seven games you still end up with 5 cents, which won't buy you anything but sympathy and very little of that. If you are lucky enough to just win one game, and it happens to be against one of the real horseshoe pitchers that has beaten everyone until he had to play you, that one win could give you half of a start on a retirement plan.

Some of the later games in the tournament can be with one player "toting" a fist full of money, while his opponent has ten cents. That should be enough to make the big money man nervous enough to allow the ten center to win the one game he needs to win just before buying the new car.

Playing the games to 21 points gives the lower percentage pitchers a better shot at winning, if there is a large percentage spread in the class. It is easier to knock off the big guys in a 21 point game than a 40 point game.


Sound like this might be a easy, fun tournament for a club to use to add some variety to their league play.

Maybe some of you have played this before and know the real name for it, but until something better comes along, we can call it

HALVERS and "HAVER NOT".

PS. If classes are six man the entry fee can be adjusted to be \$1.60. Seven man classes can have an entry fee of \$3.20 -The entry fee can be adjusted to whatever, but should be easy numbers to halve.

Plans are in the works for a special "South of the Simcoes" tournament this year in Goldendale. The focus of the tournament will be, through advertising in local media, to make the tournament known throughout the region, and to entice the curious to come out, to pitch horseshoes.

The format will focus on introducing novices to our game and to our people. Teaming a novice pitcher up with a seasoned pitcher in a format something like what Vey Allen described on page six could challenge us to find a different way to promote our game.

Pursuant to that we've all explored and dealt with the reality that the number of horseshoe pitchers out there far exceeds the number of pitchers willing to pitch competitively. In Goldendale there is a group of individuals who go up into the mountains on memorial day and Labor day, pound stakes in the ground and pitch horseshoes. They whoop and holler, barbeque, drink beer and have a grand old time.

While I'm not suggesting that that is appropriate in a tournament setting, I am suggesting that possibly we've taken our sport to a place where we've taken the fun out of it. Possibly we've neglected the person who would pitch with us if he or she could feel us out in a setting where they didn't have to belong to the assn. to pitch. So the focus of the "South of the Simcoes" tournament will be an unsanctioned fun event. It will be different. There may be a beer garden, there will be a barbeque, there might be cowboys, there could be Indians and we will explore a 'Halvers and Have Not' doubles format that will add some excitement to the game. Make plans to bring someone who is curious about the game of horseshoes to the "South of the Simcoes" Doubles Tournament. Our aim is to get more people 'Hooked on Horseshoes'.
