13 years ago Art & Carol Sperber brought several boxes of 'stuff' to Goldendale that represented the 'tools' needed to produce Shoes News. She had been the editor for several years prior to that time and was ready to retire. When President Gene Kuiken needed someone for the job, I had indicated that I had some exposure to the process and would consider the job.

When the time came for him to select an editor, I had decided against taking the job and when Gene told me "You're the only person I've got" in a telephone conversation I got ready for a new adventure.



Elmer C. Schilperoort, 89, of Sunnyside, WA died Monday, December 12, 2011 as a result of injuries sustained in a car accident.

Elmer was born on October 8, 1922, the seventh of 12 children born to Teunis J. and Anna (Den Boer) Schilperoort. He grew up on the family farm on E. Edison

Road and graduated from Sunnyside High School in 1940. On December 12, 1941, just 5 days after the attack on Pearl Harbor, he married Lola I. Andrews, also of Sunnyside. They both worked in Seattle for a short time, and then returned to Sunnyside to live and raise their family, eventually settling on a farm just a quarter mile from his boyhood home. Elmer was a lifetime member of the Sunnyside Christian Reformed Church and served several terms on the Council. Also, as a strong supporter of Sunnyside Christian School, he was a former member of the School Board. For fun and relaxation, he developed a passion for pitching horseshoes. He and Lola loved to travel to different competitions all over the country. He loved to sing, especially in church, could yodel with the best of them and played a mean harmonica. After Lola died of cancer in December of 1985, he found solace and companionship in Oweda Worst of Yakima, who had lost her husband that same year. They eventually married on November 7, 1987.



indicated that I would be producing the newsletter electronically on a computer, a complete 'switch' from the "cut and paste" process that had been used by prior editors. Possible but not compatible with the way I contemplated doing the newsletter, was the 5.5"X8.5" format used previously. In the experience that I'd had, the newsletter was produced on a bi-fold 11"X17" format that had been done at a print shop after the master 'photo-ready' copies had been put together on a computer.

The first issue was more than a challenge, it was gut wrenching. I was familiar with Microsoft's Word program, but not all of it's 'quirks' in doing multi-page documents. When a page gets 'full' in Word, a new page is created automatically. In addition, everyone who has used a computer is familiar with the scenario of going blissfully along creating a document, and all of a sudden, without warning, it disappears. Until I learned to 'save' every few minutes, each newsletter had me pounding my head against the wall in exasperation.

Then I learned about "Publisher", a program that Microsoft created to do newsletters. I promptly went out and bought that program, the difference it made in my newsletter experience was profound.

The next challenge was reproducing photos, and producing the newsletter at a reasonable cost. Print-shops in my local area have no competition, so they're able to charge whatever they can get away with. I found the most economical path was to drive the 110 miles to Portland with the photo-ready master and do the newsletter at a Kinko's print-shop. For the first year or so that is what I did, the cost of fuel was reasonable, so the 220 mile round trip was just part of the adventure.

The price of fuel began to rise. A new "Staples" store opened in The Dalles. The staff there didn't know what they should charge, and for a couple of years I got the newsletter printed on their machines at a very reasonable cost with a 90 mile round trip.

As the staff at Staples matured in their jobs they decided that I was getting too good a 'deal', and they raised their prices. It happened that it was at a time when a new print shop was opening there that was looking for business. The offer they made was even better than Staples, but it involved two trips, one to deliver the 'master' and another to pick up the newsletter.

Again as the 'maturing' process evolved, and the staff became more familiar with the process, their prices began to rise.

About that time the 'state of the art' of printers was evolving to a place where if one could procure a printer at a reasonable price, it was possible to do the whole job without leaving home.

I began to look for a printer...a new adventure. It became clear that the pitfalls that one might fall into were several, and potentially expensive. Fortunately, Hollis Morris's son was running a Hewlett & Packard printshop in Benton City. His expertise became a valuable resource in finding a suitable HP printer that has been the answer to a host of issues in producing the newsletter. The cost of consumables has been more than I anticipated, but they are coming down, and other than a few issues of (what the hell's happening now?), being able to produce the newsletter at home in vivid color with quality photos is 'priceless'.

We at Shoes News wish all of you the best in the New Year.



The Teacher asked young Patrick Murphy: "What do you do at Christmas time?



"Very nice Patrick," she said. "Now Jimmy Brown, what do you do at Christmas?"


