appy New Year everyone! I hope your family had a wonderful holiday season. Well, getting the rust off my horseshoes didn't take too long, but getting the rust off my game isn't going to be so easy. January 2015, will mark one of the longstanding traditions in our states horseshoe pitching history, the 50th anniversary of the Winetrout Winter Open Ringer Classic. This series of 6 tournaments from January through March gives those of us who brave the elements, a chance to get our pitching skills up to a competitive level as early as possible. They also serve as a way to encourage our members to renew their state and national memberships in a timely fashion. The mileage trophy is awarded to the pitcher who has traveled the most miles, one way and competes in at least 5 of the series. The winner of the most improved percentage trophy must also compete in at least 5 of the series. Pitchers cannot win either trophy more than once. At the conclusion of the series, a mens, womens, and elders champion are named and presented with a plaque.

Scoring for the Winetrouts is also a little different. Scoring consists of counting ringers only by each pitcher in games of 40 shoes. First pitch is alternating and class

WINNIE WINETROUT, Lummi Island, Washington

Player/Organizer: Francis
"Winnie" Winetrout was a charter member of the Washington
State Association in 1927, at age
22, and pitched horseshoes for
over 50 years.

He won the World Men's Intermediate Championship in 1968 pitching 72.8% ringers. He also won the Intermediate title again in 1969. In 1969 he finished in second place at the Washington State Tournament.

His promotion efforts highlighted his career, he established the first state association newsletter, he originated the Winter Classic Open

which was later renamed the Winetrout Winter Open Classic. In 1974, he was part of the first class of inductees into the Washington State Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame.

He sponsored state junior champions to attend World Tournaments. He served on the NHPA Hall of Fame Committee. Winnie was recipient of the President's Award in 1989 and received the Stokes Memorial Award in 1993. He passed away in 2005 at age 100

Jerry Clark: I am halfway through my chemo treatments which are scheduled to be over in February. The bladder surgery will take place in March. Thank you for your prayers and concern.



Good Sportsmanship Is Always Important

Good sportsmanship and courteous conduct on the courts is an important factor.

A player must not make any distracting noise or movement while his opponent is in the act of pitching. This includes filing or "clinking" his shoes together, talking or standing in front of the stake.

Players may pitch from whichever side of the pitcher's box they choose and there is nothing to prevent both players from using the same side, as only one can pitch at the same time.

Never pick up or move the shoes until agreement has been reached and the score called to the scorekeeper.

Do not step on or over the foul line when delivering your shoes. It will not help your game any to infringe on the foul line, so form the habit of staying back of it. Shake hands before and after each game.

WSHPA Horseshoe Flashbacks

Washington's "Winter Open Classic" Tournament

Washington States first annual winter series horseshoe tournament, to be known as the "Winter Open Classic," got underway Sunday, January 9,1966 at Seattle's Woodland Park Courts with 20 pitchers around the state divided into 3 classes, played in very favorable 50 degree Jan. weather.

Francis Winetrout among 7 other contenders won class "A" which was divided in 2 groups of 4 each. Bill Van Egdom in a field of 6, won class "B". Ralph Taylor won all 5 games to become class "C" champ.

Forest Reed, president of the Yakima Horseshoe Club and his devoted wife, deserves some special recognition for having come the farthest, 160 miles, and traveled on compact snow and through a snow-storm part way over the Cascade Mts. To participate in this tournament only to lose to Ralph Taylor.

This tournament to be played every other Sunday through April, is scheduled this time of the year primarily to induce our state pitchers to become state and national members before playing in the regular spring and summer tournaments, there-by making the secretary's job less burden-some later on.

The first entry fee for our state pitchers is \$3.00 which entitles them to a state and national membership and the privilege of playing for a trophy and a wall plaque that is competed for for 10 years. Any out-of-state pitcher is welcome providing he has a state and national card and shares equal cost of a trophy awarded to each class winner. The pitcher who wins the most tournaments in his class at the conclusion of the series is awarded a plaque with his name and the year inscribed on it and takes possession of such plaque until tournament play resumes the following winter.

FROM THE ARCHIVES OF NHPA NEWSLETTERS: The Horseshoe Pitchers News Digest, February 1966

SEATTLE AND EVERETT HAVE BEEN HOSTS TO THE WINETROUTS

Seattle's Woodland Park courts hosted the Winetrouts from 1966-1984. Everett put in new courts in 1984. The 1985, 1986 & 1987 Winetrouts alternated with three in Seattle and three in Everett each year. From 1988 to 1990 the Winetrouts were held in Everett. In 1991 it was Seatte/Everett alternating again. From 1992 on it seems to have been all Everett. Up until 1998, the tournaments alternated Saturdays and Sundays with a few exceptions.

I've not found anything in the minutes regarding the reason for the change except for the fact of the new courts in Everett. As I remember, we had the use of the building near the pool in Everett, at least part of the time, so that may have made some difference. In Seattle they used plastic around the walls of the picnic shelter to keep the wind out and charcoal barbeques to try to keep people warm, but it was not pleasant on the cold days of January and February.


Casey Sluys Wins 2014 World Tournament Experience Raffle
