Remembering Harold "Hal" Brewer June 5, 1932—June 8, 2016







On the tournament trail with....Archie Silcox

Archie was born in Wichita Falls, TX, but has spent most of his life in Washington state. He has an AA degree in Art, hence has spent most of his life in the Sign business. He has been married to Carol for 53 years and have 4 kids, two of them older than Jay Buhner. He is retired Air Force, and at our family picnics growing up, we played lots of horseshoes.

My first horseshoe meeting was with Gary Bowlby in 1990. He was practicing in Silverdale, at the waterfront park, and I asked if I could pitch with him. He told me about pitching and I couldn't believe that there was organized horseshoe clubs all around the state. I started pitching in the Kitsap Horseshoe Club which was a real good way to start with Art and Carol Sperber, Herb Criss, Bob Clark and his family. Four of us, Wayne Koletzki, Gary Bowlby, Terry Wood and I, would practice for hours on our own courts we built. The four of us used to practice three times a week until after dark, we would play from memory and listen for the sound of steel on steel the rest of the night.

My first game was in Port Townsend. Class D, should have been Class F. I didn't even know how to keep score. I tied with Bob Jewett and came in second.

My most "memorable" game was with Gene Kuiken. I had a pretty comfortable 36-9 lead when he stopped me right in the middle of my turn to say, "Silcox, this is the last score you are going to get in this game, and I'm going to win." I didn't play badly the rest of the way, he just came on strong, very strong and got me at the finish line 40-36. It was a very painful lesson.

What I enjoy most about playing horseshoes, is the people. I've met some of the finest people on the courts and I enjoy the competition it stirs up. People may get mad but they generally keep their composure. One of my favorite places to play is Burlington, thanks Jon Turnbull and gang along the Skagit River.

One interesting note: When living in Spokane, a number of years earlier, I was really involved in karate and made black belt with a buddy of mine who happened to live next door to Henry Knauft. I wish I would have known that sooner, I could have played horseshoes with one of the greatest.

I have pitched in one World Tournament in 2000 in Bismark, ND. I pitched in Class D and took 15th place. In state competition, I've won two State Class Championships and took 2nd a couple of times also.

My best advice to new pitchers: Practice with someone who is better than you, it will make you a better pitcher. The grip I started with was the picnic flop and then to 1 3/4 and 1 1/2 turns. I can move back and forth between them. I have used Ted Allens and now my favorites are Dead Eye (heavies). I have been recovering from D.E. (blood clots) and am now at 30Ft. and getting back into the game. My average is slowly improving. You 40 ft pitchers had better be on
