he 2009 "World" tournament Schedule has been published. Monday morning at 7:00 AM on the 27th. of July, pitchers will begin pitching their first rounds at the Prairie Capitol Convention Center in Springfield, Illinois. There will be five rounds of pitching during class play .The last round will commence at 8:00 PM each day.

An early 'get up' is in store for those whose rounds begin at 7:00 AM. Pitchers must be available for check-in and photos one hour before their scheduled pitching time.

In the first round of pitching, starting on July 27th., 4 of the 19 WA pitchers will start their rounds in Mens classes. In L2, Jeff Saunders, will begin pitching at 7:00 AM, at 10:15 in K1, Jim Quist, will begin, and at 1:30 PM, in H1, Gary Fuller will start as will **Michael Watcher** in H2. They will pitch 5 games each day for three days.

The second round begins on Wed, July 30th. Class play begins at 7:00 AM for all four of WA's juniors, Matt Fuller, Truman Hopper, Kaiti Reeves, and Reuben Hopper. Class play also begins for Orlean Clinton In Mens C1 at 1:30 PM.

The 12 top finishers in the Jr. Boys and the 6 top finishers in the Jr. Girls divisions will move into the Championship Rounds. Junior Championship rounds will begin at 4:45 on July 31st and a new Junior boys and Girls Champion will have been named by the end of the first week on August 1st. .

The NHPA convention will start at 8:30 AM on Sunday. After a church service, the HOF and awards banquet will begin at 5:30 PM at the President Abraham Lincoln Hotel.

All the rest of WA pitchers begin their preliminary rounds on Monday the 3rd. of August. Hollis Morris, Elders H will begin at 7:00 AM. He will be followed at 10:15 by Mr. Tricky, Elders A, Russ Phillips Elders B, Art Sperber Elders C, and Paul







TITCOMB TEACHES THE GAME

The game of horseshoes can be broken down into three basic steps one, throwing an open shoe; two, acquiring alignment and distance; and three, developing a rhythm pitch.

I place opening the shoe first with a beginner to impress upon them the importance of controlling the action of a turning shoe. Once a beginner has confidence in opening his shoe, he can concentrate on alignment and distance. The third step, that of developing a rhythm pitch, is a result of the first two.

Each pitcher will fall into a natural rhythm of his own and should not try to copy someone else in exact detail. The step, the swing, and the release should blend into a natural movement.

A natural rhythm permits a pitcher to pitch with ease and comfort. A pitcher who forces his shoe is an erratic pitcher and can go on only a short period of time. They are streak pitchers, blowing hot and cold. For the long game fought against a player of equal caliber, one can not worry about anything except pitching ringers.

OPENING THE SHOE

Whether your turn is as little as one quarter turn or as much as two and a half turns, it will be regulated by the position of the hand on the shoe and the angle at which the shoe leaves your hand. For example, my turn and a quarter can be held fairly flat during the release and will angle during the swing. Attempting to hold the shoe flat throughout the swing will destroy the alignment.

My advice is to use the shoe weight as much as possible in making the shoe turn. This will make your pitch easier and help in the development of a natural turn. Success in using the shoe weight in your turn depends on how much you use the weight in your swing. Just as in bowling, getting the shoe out away from the body and letting it drop will cause an increase in momentum, which in turn develops a natural release and turn.

ACQUIRING ALIGNMENT AND DISTANCE

Step one is part of the alignment and distance too. I have never been able to tell anyone exactly when the shoe leaves my hand. All I know is that it leaves when it is ready.

A pitcher should let his body help in the delivery of the shoe by bending it during the down swing, enough to help but not enough to force the pitch.

I can control my alignment throughout the swing by keeping my aiming point down and up the stake with my eyes on a spot six inches from the bottom of the stake. I also try to control the direction of my step by making sure that my feet are turned in the direction of the stake. Right handers stepping out with their left foot should control that step by having the right foot pointed toward the stake before taking a step.

DEVELOPING A RHYTHM PITCH

The third step is the most important step, and it is at the same time the easiest one. A good athlete in any sport must be consistent. Horseshoes are no exception. One must develop and keep the same rhythm while they are pitching to maintain a steady game. when you find, keep, and control this rhythm, you will be able to pitch your game through rainouts or other interruptions.

Search for a natural rhythm that will permit you to combine your step, your swing, and your release into one continuous fluid motion.





In 1972 Herb Okeson, secretary of the Washington Horseshoe Pitchers Association, began the work of forming the Washington Horseshoe Pitcher Hall of Fame.

The format of the Hal of Fame was brought before the Planning Board that had been formed to negotiate new issues and settle the problems that appear during the year. To discuss these issues and arrive at a solution which would be presented to the membership, for approval at the annual meeting.

Ellis West, president of the Washington State Horseshoe Pitchers association, appointed 'Ralph Tayor, Don Tysver and Herb Okeson as the committee to set up the guidelines and platform for the Hall of Fame.

After several meetings, the committee suggested the following guide lines be sent to each of the newly appointed Hal of Fame Board....Henry Knauft, Chairman, Don Tysver, Gene Patrick, Ralph Taylor and Ed Fishel.

You have been selected to serve on the "Hall of Fame" oard of this State. We hope you will be able to serve on this board with the other four members, who have been selected from various sections of the State, to act on all dossiers sent in, and to accumulate any information about members and previous members you think would make likely candidates for our "Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame".

The candidates selected by the board, will be inducted into the Hall at the Annual Meeting.

It is recommended that no more than five be inducted the first year and one or two in the ensuing years, as the occasion demands.

The dossier of each candidate can be submitted through the local club or sent directly to the chairman of the Hall of Fame board. The dossier must cover, as complete as possible, the history of his or her activity in the "Sport of Pitching Horseshoes".

The standards shall be very high! In order to make the award more meaningful.

Voting instructions:

- 1. Voting on candidates, by the board, shall be by secret ballot, giving 3 points for first, 2 points for second, and 1 point for third. For a candidate to be inducted, 12 points are required.
- 2. Points to consider, (not listed in order of importance).
 - A. Participation, (including length of time)
 - B. Promotion
 - C. Sportsmanship
 - D. Ability

Because of the distance involved, the work of the board, under the direction of the chairman, will be done by correspondence.

It is with great pleasure that this board of very capable men has been selected to fulfill this duty, which is so important to our organization.

There are two "Hall of Fame" plaques, both were designed and built by Herb Okeson, secretary of the Washington Horseshoe pitchers Association. The large plaque is at present, on display at Long acres Race Track. The smaller one is shown at tournaments all over the state. Each candidate inducted, receives and individual plaque to keep as a memento. These plaques were also designed by Herb Okeson.

There have been two changes on the Hall of Fame board, Ralph Taylor was replaced by Alice Van Egdom and Gene Patrick was replaced by Jack Smith.

Of the candidates inducted, Mr. John Monosmith has been inducted into the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association Hall of Fame.




