Commentary: *Jim Link*

It was bittersweet to win my class at what we all knew was the last "Money Tournament" in Hermiston. There's no way to find the words that would describe how each of us felt, knowing that this was the end of this Classic Tournament but we all knew that we were losing something valuable to our sport.

My mother gave me a set of picnic horseshoes as a gift sometime in the '80's. After having lain in the box for several years, I finally got them out, pounded the stakes in the ground, and began to pitch horseshoes. After a couple of years, of throwing them with little success, I concluded that there had to be "a right way to do this". That was in 1990.

Looking for organized horseshoe pitching before the internet took me to the local library, where in the 'Thomas Register' I found a telephone number of Donnie Roberts, the then secretary of the National Horseshoe Pitching Association.

The recording on the other end of that phone # explained that Mr. Roberts was conducting a tournament at a state fair, somewhere back East, and to call back in a couple of weeks.

I did. Mr. Roberts explained that each region of the country had a 'Regional Director', and that I should contact Rick Reb-

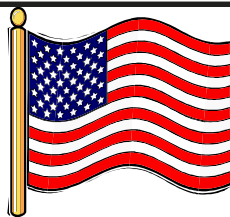

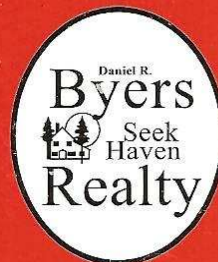

man of Hermiston, and that he would direct me in how to connect with the NHPA.

I did. Rick answered my call with information that he was conducting a tournament the very next weekend, (The Money Tournament) and that if I could come to the courts in Hermiston, he would introduce me to horseshoe pitching.

I found the courts, Rick introduced me to Vey Allen, the then President of the WSHPA, Vey conducted a clinic that introduced me to horseshoe pitching and changed my life forever. The influence that pitching horseshoes has had on my life ever since that time is profound, but that's a story for another time.

In front of us, as we sat in the bleachers, was the championship class that included several of the best horseshoe pitchers in the world. Some names I remember were Ben Wiedrich, Peter Clark, Herb Criss, Henry 'Hank' Knauft, Art Sperber, Barry Chapelle, Les Myers, Jerry Gorton...it was a 12 person class, and likely the averages were all over 70%.

Vey described the different deliveries, "Art pitches a 1 3/4 turn, Peter, Herb and Ben pitch the 1 1/4. but watch Ben, his is a low fast shoe". I said, "I suppose when he misses, the shoe ends up in the back of the court?" "He don't miss" replied Vey. Ben was many times the Oregon State Champion and was for years the champion of the Money Tournament as well. Henry Knauft was pitching in a court right in front of us. "Listen to Hank's shoes" said Vey. Instead of the usual. 'clank' there was a subdued 'click' as the shoe hit the stake. "What's with that?" I inquired. "He pitches brass shoes" was Vey's answer. (Those brass shoes, are now in the WSHPA HOF trailer.)

This was serious horseshoe pitching, and I was amazed. In those classes at that time, seldom were there single points recorded, one of the contestants would likely have two shoes on the stake after every turn. The only points recorded were when one shoe missed, spun off, or glanced off the peg. A string of '4 deads' could go on for a dozen innings.

The Money Tournament, the pitchers who pitched there, the horseshoe pitching records that were made there, are part of a horseshoe pitching legacy that history will record as significant in the story of our sport, but to all who were a part of it, it was much more than that...it was the pinnacle of horseshoe pitching in the Northwest.

Monasmith. Handwritten on the first page in beautiful script were the words: *"It was not to goo a game between I and Gene", but it was my second win in a row. Pitching against competition like Gene learned me to pitch under pressure. It took me almost 3 seasons of play to win my 1st. Game from him"*. That was in the year of 1949, and contrary to the way our sport is covered today, throughout the scrapbook are newspaper clippings. The clippings include not only informational news articles but also commentary and pictures. In the scrapbook also are many photos and striking also is the detail of people and places. That was truly a different era. An example of John's writing is on page 6.

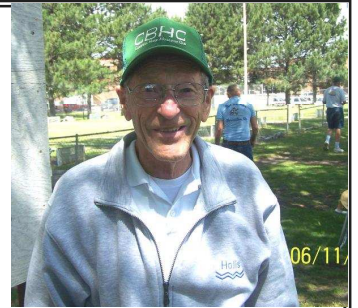

Paul (Kingtut) Tutewiler interviews Hollis Morris



While I was at the Oregon Money Tournament, I had the opportunity to sit down and chat with Hollis Morris. Hollis was born in Chewelah Washington and has (3) brothers and (3) sisters. I asked how he got started in pitching horseshoes. He said that he started pitching at the TTN (Thousand Trails/ Naco) campgrounds in the late 1980's, but the two people that were very instrumental were Vey Allen and the late Pat Quinn. Hollis did say that his wife Evelyn encouraged a lot to keep him at it.

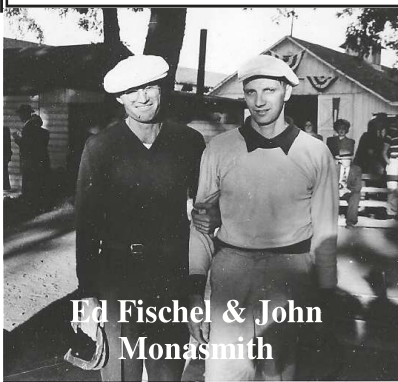


Hollis joined the WSHPA and NHPA at the Columbia Basin and later became the President of Club for (13) or (14) years. He told me that the start of the Eastgate courts are credited to the hard work of Pat Quinn.

When Hollis originally started pitching at the 40 foot, his average was somewhere 15% and progressed to the low to mid 30's. Hollis moved up to the 30 foot mark at the young age of (76) and is maintaining an average in the 40% range. Hollis has been to about (7) World Tournaments, but so far has not won a 1st place, although he has won several 1st places at the Washington State Tournaments.

Hollis has (4) grandsons that at one or more times have pitched at a tournament at the same time in different classes, which is something that few of us will ever do. I asked Hollis if there was any memorable games he could recall and the only ones he can is since he moved up to the 30 foot. He did mention at a State Tournament he had only one loss and that was to Vey Allen. He was very pleased with that outcome.

I think Hollis said he has horseshoe pits at his home where he practices, but I think he practices with the club also. Hollis said that if there was anybody he could think of that he would like to emulate it would be the late Pat Quinn.
