he 2014 World Horseshoe Tournament takes place from July 14th through the 26th in Buffalo/ Hamburg NY. Best wishes to all our WSHPA entrants who are making the trip to New York state to participate in this years Championship tournament. You will find the pitching schedules for all our participants in this issue of Shoes News.

Although the WSHPA is relatively small in terms of numbers compared to many other states, we have certainly held our own in recent years in terms of top level performances on the World stage. Matt Fuller won the 2010 Jr. World Championship, after placing second in 2009. Russ Phillips followed that up, with an Elders World title in 2011. Phyl Quist won her class at the championships that same year. There have been additional class championships by Monty McLaughlin and John McCarthy III in 2013 at St. George, Utah, as well as some other strong finishes by our members. Both Matt Fuller and Don Davis pitched in the Mens class A-1 and in the Mens Championship Class, and Patrick McCarthy pitched in the Cadet Championship Class, as well as Russ Phillips in the Elders Championship Class...This year as I follow online, the results of our Washington contingent, and hope they bring home

THE 40' FLIP.... ALIVE AND WELL



As we work our way through the pitching season, we see many different styles of pitching. There are numerous types of grips, and turns, 13/4, 11/4, 3/4 are some of the more common ones. There are quite a few 30' flip shoe pitchers, and rightly so, because the flip from that distance can be very effective, but throwing any type of flip shoe from 40' is a whole different ballgame, and there aren't very many pitchers doing it. The three pictured above, Monty McLaughlin, Gerald Stangland, and Ron McLaughlin, are three of the best, but John Bruhn, and Rob Churchill are a couple more very good ones that come to mind. The thing that makes the 40' flip so challenging, is maintaining good alignment, and avoiding those dreaded bounce- offs. Those turn shoe guys are really good.... but long live the flip!


Ted was the significant person who started the Seattle Horseshoe Club. Later he had yearly tournaments in Sequim, where he lived for awhile.

Ted traveled with Jim and myself several times. One year Jim, Ted and Peter Clark drove our van to the Spearfish, S.D. World tournament. Ted was driving the van and it was time to change drivers. He stopped and got out but failed to set the brake and the van started rolling. It ran over his foot. Peter jumped over to the driver's seat and stopped it. Ted didn't get hurt, just had a sore foot – but it could have been worse.

Another trip was to the Bismark, N.D. tournament. On the way home the air bag suspension system broke in our car and it was a very bumpy hard ride home. Ted said it was the worst ride ever! He also went with us to Kitchener, Ontario. He wasn't feeling well and he called 911 for the medic's. They checked him over, could find nothing wrong, they said he was okay. He was staying in a different dorm than we were and I think he was just lonesome and needed some attention!

The last time I saw Ted was at the Pacific Northwest in Yakima. His dear friend, Gigi, brought him over and he was in his glory just watching the pitching, keeping score and telling the stories of horseshoes through the years.

Ted was a very dear friend and a very special man. He will be missed.




