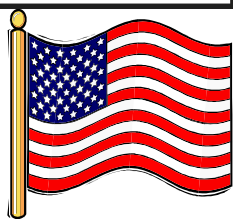

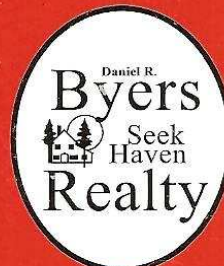

those Saturday evenings, but forgotten by Thursday, when we pull out the newsletter, call the TD for next Saturday's tournament.

It's not a bad way to spend a summer. When we get to a place where we begin to wonder if it's worth it, invariably something comes along that renews the spirit and, rejuvenates us.

That happened at the Memorial Day Open. Even though it costs \$60 to fill a modest size tank with fuel, initially we had 30 pitchers signed up to come to Goldendale, more than 200 miles for some. They came, they pitched, they had a good time, they enjoyed good food, and most importantly, some local people who did not know that organized horseshoe pitching was going on in Goldendale came to the park to visit with a relative who was pitching. They bought a set of Super Ringers, and want to sign up to pitch.

Anyone who tries to promote horseshoe pitching is in a continual quandary, in how to best organize time, money and resources available in finding ways that will attract others to our sport. When it gets shucked down to the cob, what works best is what we keep saying all along. "It's the people". When people see what we're up to and have a connection, they get curious. So invite people to our tournaments. Feed them, show them what we're up to, get their address, and we'll send them a complimentary copy of the newsletter. RULE 2 – GAME PREPARATION

Section A – Court Assignment

Each contestant shall find his or her court assignment and warm up on that court for their first game. The court shall be prepared for play in a timely manner so that all games can begin at about the same time.

Section B – Pit Preparation and Maintenance

Contestants (or designee) are responsible for preparing one of the pits of their assigned courts before each game. This preparation includes watering and turning of the clay (if needed), to keep it in a soft, putty-like condition. Upon completion, the pit material shall be level, with no evidence of a "dome" or "pocket" within the scoring area. For raised pits, the pit material should be prepared in the same way as above, and at a depth of four inches (4"), within the scoring area. Once a game has started, clay pit material within the scoring area may not be moved or altered without consent of the opponent. Sand or dirt pit material, however, may be re-leveled during the game, without consent of the opponent. Any pit material moved for the measurement of a shoe or for the removal of a "buried" shoe may be replaced.

Section C – Painting of Stakes

To make the stakes more visible for the contestants, they may be painted between games (white paint is often used) so that there is a good contrast between the color of the stake and the color of the backboard. The painting of stakes shall not be allowed while a game is in progress, unless both contestants are in agreement.

Section D – Start of Each Tournament/Class

The tournament officials will make an announcement when it is time for the tournament/class to begin. The first game should not begin before this announcement. The flip of a shoe(s) or coin(s) shall signify the beginning of each game. The winner of the flip will have choice of first or second pitch.

PLATE & PLAQUE AWARD PROCEEDURE FOR WASH. STATE

As we have quite a few new pitchers and there is always some question as to how plates are determined, the following is the outline in our By-Laws:

Number of players in a class	Plates awarded
3 or 4	1 st place
5 or 6	1 st , 2 nd
7 or 8	1 st , 2 nd , 3 rd
9 or 10	1 st , 2 nd , 3 rd , 4 th
11 or 12	1 st , 2 nd , 3 rd , 4 th , 5 th

After an individual player has won his/her first five (5) plates, a plaque, shaped in the outline of Washington State, will be presented to that individual. When a player has been awarded sufficient plates to fill the plaque (thirteen (13) additional plates) a second plaque will be presented after the 19th plate is won, etc.

All plates and plaques are awarded at the State Tournament each year. If you are unable to attend, the plates & plaques will be given to the Club presidents for distribution. I will not be mailing any awards anymore as the cost has become prohibitive.

Paul (kingtut) Tutewiler interviews Stan Speers

I sat down with Stan Speers to find out a little about his

history in the game of Horseshoes.

Stan was born in White Owl South Dakota. His father was an avid horseshoe pitcher and was pretty good at the sport. Stan has (5) brothers and he recalls that whenever they did something that they were not supposed to do, their dad would make them go out and pitch horseshoes. (Knowing Stan and his brother Bert, they probably pitched a lot of shoes.) He remembers when he was about (7) or(8) years old, his dad would drive a stake in the ground and then throw a horseshoe. Where-ever it landed, he would drive the other stake in the ground. He would say that it might not be 40 feet, but it's close enough.

Stan has only been a member of the WSHPA and NHPA for about (15) or (16) years, but is not a newcomer to the game of horseshoe pitching. When he first started pitching in sanctioned tournaments, his average was about 32%, but he had been pitching a lot prior to becoming a WSHPA and NHPA member. He has a set of pits at his home and practices almost daily. He also drives an hour each way (twice a week) to pitch at the Olympia Horseshoe Club.

Stan went to the World Tournament in Gillette Wyoming (don't know what year) entering in his class with a 62% at 40 feet, but he can't remember where he finished. He throws a 3/4 turn and has never thrown anything different but he enjoys the sport of horseshoes so much that he got (6) horseshoe pits installed at the Park in Toledo Washington, with the majority of the work and finances accomplished by Stan himself. Now he hosts a non-sanctioned tournament the first Sunday after the 4th of July at the Cheese Festival in Toledo Washington. I have participated at that tournament for the last (3) years and there is a lot of fun to be had and good food.

I asked Stan if he could recall anything about the game of horseshoes that stood out, and he remembered that while growing up, times were pretty tough and his dad came home from a horseshoe tournament with (4) new tires and a lot of groceries.

Talking with Stan, I found out that he won 1st place at the Washington State Tournament in 1999. I asked Stan if there was anyone he would like to emulate, and he couldn't think of anybody, but said do the best you can and be a good sport.


