Vey Allen and Jim Link collaborated on the format of this sheet and massaged it into an Excel Spreadsheet which can be downloaded into your computer.

In the spreadsheet, when you enter a number into a cell, the computer will compute the numbers and add the totals into the appropriate columns. Cells with formulas in them, are locked to prevent the formulas from being compromised. If you need to unlock and change a cell that can be done as well.

Hi All- Just a short note to let you know that On Thursday Feb. 5 at around 2:15 pm I suffered a mild to moderate heart attack. I was at home and recognized the mild chest tightness, cold sweat and shortness of breath as symptoms, so had Marge drive me to the Richland hospital. They rushed me right in and after an electrocardiogram showed that I was having an acute heart attack (acute means currently in progress) they proceeded to do an angioplasty stent in my Right Cardiac Artery. The artery was completely blocked. From the start of the attack until the stent procedure was completed was less than two hours. I was in the hospital until noon Saturday Feb. 7. I am home now and doing ok. I am to check back with the doctors next week to determine what damage if any to my heart. I am on easy duty now, no strenuous effort to be exerted during the next 30 days. I feel great and am hopeful that little to no permanent damage happened. I thank the Good Lord that he helped me to recognize what was occurring and watched over me during this time. I would appreciate your prayers for a complete recovery. Vey



For those who wondered if horseshoe pitching had gone 'politically correct' in the calls here are the latest recommended calls from horseshoepitching.com

Here are the **recommended** calls for points allowed, in the following situations:


- No ringers with the closest shoe in count call "one point".
- No ringers with the two (2) closest shoes in count call "two points".
- One (1) ringer with either no shoe in count or the other contestant having the closest shoe in count call "one ringer, three points".
- One (1) ringer with the closest shoe in count call "one ringer, four points".
- Two (2) cancelled ringers with the closest shoe in count call "two dead, one point".
- Two (2) cancelled ringers with one (1) un-cancelled ringer call "two dead, three points".

Two (2) un-cancelled ringers – call "two ringers, six points".

Note: No points shall be awarded in the following situations.

- All four (4) shoes out of count call "no score".
- Two (2) cancelled ringers with no other shoes in count call "two dead, no score".

Four (4) cancelled ringers – call "four dead".



same pitch could generate some interest. As soon as this issue of Shoes News is in the mail, I plan to start that campaign through the national newsletter, and the NHPA website.

When a club establishes courts in a city park, the courts are owned by the city, and managed through the various entities of the cities governmental structure. In Goldendale, parking in E'Kone park became an issue after the election of a new mayor. There was an ordinance that had been drafted years ago to prevent transients from parking overnight in the park. The mayor wanted it enforced.

After several visits to the council, there has been a dramatic change in the attitude of the city council and the mayor of how the park should be used. They are establishing several full hookups for RV's at the park and have agreed that when an event permit is issued. parking will be allowed.

Difficult as it is to work with bureaucracies, if one perseveres, as several clubs around the state have, positive results can be achieved. I think of Everett where John Alexander has permitted the use of the courts and a clubhouse for several years through his committed work in maintaining the courts. Burlington is another success story, and there are several others, Spokane, Odessa, Tri-Cities. We can learn from those who work in those communities how to maintain harmony with those bureaucracies.


