1. To make the website more modern and appealing.


2. To make it easier to navigate.


3. To add more valuable information.

#### HISTORY OF SKAGIT VALLEY HORSESHOE CLUB BY FRED MESMAN

Around the year 1970, brothers Fred and Francis Mesman, went to the Sedro Woolley Logger Rodeo to play in the horseshoe games. There we met Bill Owens. From him we learned that the horseshoe games had been cancelled. While visiting with Bill, he invited us to his house. Bill's house was located on the McCorquedale Road (now part of I-5 Auto World). At this time Bill Owens had a horseshoe court underneath his house.

About a week or so later, Bill called us and wanted to know if we would be interested in starting a horseshoe club. So we met and discussed things about it. We needed a place to put the horseshoe courts. We decided to rent a piece of land on the East side of Bill's warehouse from Harold & Margaret Frye. Ken Ellestad, a builder and friend of Bills, came over with his surveying tripod and helped us lay out the courts. Ken was also a horseshoe pitcher and one of our first members. We had eighteen horseshoe courts.

Later we cleared out Bill's roofing supply warehouse and put in four horseshoe courts indoors. Then we had a place to play in the winter time. More players gradually came to play.

Some early players I recall are: Mike Sloan, Don McDougle, Harold Summers, Charlie King, Bart Barber, Dick Mueller and Jack McNutt.

Bill Owens, Fred Mesman, Francis Mesman and Ken Ellestad were the first Skagit Valley horseshoe pitchers.


