WSHPA Executive Board Minutes—February 14, 2015

Winetrout III........The meeting was called to order by President Don. The secretary read the previous meeting minutes, they were approved. **Treasurer's Report:** Rhonda Davis read the following, it was approved Bank of America: checking \$2,997.47; Savings 1 \$6,143.37; Savings \$7,532.17 Total \$16,673.01.

Washington Federal CDs: \$5,102.22, \$5,5102.22, \$53,627.58 Total \$63,832.02 Grand Total: \$80,505.03. Jr Promo: \$1,325.07.

Memberships:

2011: 152 adults and 11 juniors. Total: 163

2012: 142 adults and 14 juniors. Total: 156 (down 7)

2015: as of 2/8/15: 68 adults and 2 juniors. Total 70 and 19 associates. **Junior Promotions:** Phyl Quist reminded us that she is stepping down, but has yet to have anyone volunteer to take her place.

<u>Hall of Fame:</u> Russ Phillips is the Chairman this year. Nominations should be sent to him.

<u>Promotions:</u> Chairman Jon Turnbull says he's hoping to put out a state brochure this year. He will find out the cost. He suggests following Hollis Morris's idea of carrying horseshoe business cards with us to hand out whenever we meet someone who might be interested. The idea of working the coffee booth at a rest stop came up, but it requires getting on a waiting list for 1 or 2 years.

<u>Nominating Committee</u>: It was suggested that we need a committee to seek out candidates to run for President next year, as well as to find anyone interested in taking over as Recoding Secretary or Junior Promotions Chairman.

Everett Courts Work Party: Gaylord reported that they had replaced several stakes recently. Other work, such as roofing & painting needs to be done in the summer weather. A time for this will be planned.

<u>Second Vice-President:</u> Jeannette McCarthy has resigned. Pres. Don will select someone to take her place.

<u>State Doubles:</u> Don says they will be like a "bar league" - non-walking. You can use your own shoes, but must walk down to pick them up, or you and your partner can bring them to exchange at half-court. It will be 40 shoes.

<u>Shoes News Ads:</u> Rhonda reminded us that it's time to pay the club ads for 2015.

<u>Move-Ups to 30 ft:</u> Rhonda and Jerry Conklin reminded us that you must let one of them know if you move from 40 to 30 feet, and if you move from state to state.

2015 World Tournament, Topeka, Kansas: Entry deadline is May 15. Phyl wll be selling tickets for the big World Tournament raffle. Meeting was adjourned.

All Entries must be on this form and mailed with a postmark no later than May 18, 2015. Entries received with a postmark after May 18th shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the tournament only as space is available. All adults must have pitched in a minimum of four (4) US/Canadian sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months prior to May 18, 2015, in the same division you are entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS / CANSTATS on May 25th.

Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. NHPA and CANADIAN entrants must show their 2015 membership card when checking in.

REGISTRATION FEES: ALL ADULTS -- \$130.00 · ALL JUNIORS -- \$25.00 · U.S. FUNDS ONLY

CANADIAN ENTRIES MUST USE MONEY ORDERS REGISTRATION FEE INCLUDES SCORE KEEPING FEES

You may enter at anytime prior to May 18th.

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2015. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2015, is older than 70, or has an approved medical exemption may enter the ELDERS DIVISION. Entrants in the JUNIOR BOY and JUNIOR GIRL DIVISION must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2015 calendar year.

JUNIOR CADET DIVISION entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2015 calendar year.

Note # 1. A Social Security number is required from all adult pitchers that move up to the Championship Classes.

Note # 2. For class play, a minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Preliminaries.

The pitching schedule will be finalized by May 31st and published on the NHPA website. If you indicated above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the first week in June.

The NHPA Hall of Fame Banquet will be held July 19th. Tickets can be purchased from the NHPA office or at the World Tournament NHPF booth.


