Our Winetrouts are half done for 2016, and we have been seeing real nice turnouts so far averaging about 35 pitchers per tournament. A reminder to the Executive Board members, our meeting will be held before Winetrout V on March 12th, and the Junior Auction and Potluck will be after Winetrout VI on March 26th. It is very encouraging for me to see a good number of pitchers coming to the tournament so far. A number of them are from Enumclaw and the Skagit Valley area, and from everything I've seen these guys are real solid pitchers. To all our new pitchers, the six Winetrout tournaments are unique. They are scored, ringers only, and alternate pitch. When the regular season starts with the Tulip Open in Burlington on April 9th, we switch to cancellation scoring, and first pitch must be earned on each end. It's a little more challenging, but that's what makes it so much fun.

On the tournament trail with Art & Carol Sperber

Art & Carol Sperber have been married for almost 63 years, and have lived in the same house on Chico Way in Bremerton since 1961. All three of their children; Mary Anderson, Ann Almond and Bob Sperber are nearing retirement age. They have seven grandchildren; Emily Gerber, Jakob Anderson, Neil Anderson, Kara Turner, James Almond, William Almond and Elisabeth Shepherd, and six

and 1/2 great grandchildren.

Carol grew up in Cosmopolis WA (near Aberdeen) and lived in Central Park (between Aberdeen and Montesano). She attended Weatherwax High School in Aberdeen. Her first employment was in her father's shoe repair shop in Aberdeen for several years. She attended Grays Harbor College and then Western Washington College of Education (now University in Bellingham). While going to college she clerked at a local dime store and Sears. Carol was an elementary school teacher in Olympia, Garibaldi OR and Silverdale plus also did some substitute teaching. Art grew up in Tillamook OR and attended Tillamook High School. Art's



first employment was working for farmer's in haying and cleaning barns etc. Next he worked in sawmills and then as a helper in one of Tillamook's cheese factories where they won a Blue Ribbon for their cheese in OR and then Wisconsin. After two years at Western Oregon college (now University), in 1951 Art was drafted in to the army where he was involved with the 7th Infantry Division in the Korean War. When he was released he went to work as an elementary teacher in Girabaldi OR. During the summers he completed his BA at OCE. Four years later, he and Carol moved to Creswell OR where he was a teaching principal and coached in the Junior High. During the summers, he attended the University of Oregon to complete his masters degree. After three years they moved to Bremerton where Art was an elementary teacher and principal until he retired in 1983 to become a horseshoe pitcher.

In addition, they have bicycled in England and the Netherlands several times. She has also had a lot of fun with the family history— having written several booklets about their families, and with daughter, Mary, she has researched family history in Rhode Island and in England. Carol has a number of hobbies and interests in her leisure time, including cross word and jigsaw puzzles, browsing the Web, watching TV sports, PBS TV, listening to public radio and reading-especially British mysteries. Art enjoys fishing and hunting and also does a lot of reading. Carol pitches in two Kitsap leagues during the summer and one in the winter. As a youngster, she pitched a bit with her dad, but most or her exposure to horseshoes came when Art picked up the game. Art pitched with his father and brother as a teenager but first saw league action at Cornwall Park in Bellingham in 1975 during a time when they lived there while Carol went to college during the summer. Bob Edwards of the Bellingham club showed Art the ropes and got him started pitching with them. He told him that Bremerton had a horseshoe club and league which Art looked in to when home. Carol attended many horseshoe tournaments as a spectator in the late 70's and 80's, then began keeping score. Carol started practicing at home in 1987 and started pitching in leagues at about the same time. Her beginning average in September 1987 was 11.92%. By June 1989 she was up to 21.38%. Carol has been a member of the WSHPA for 28 years. She was the Shoes News editor for six years, and WSHPA secretary for 15 years. During that time she estimates sending out more than 200 cards, get well, sympathy, cheer etc to members and their families. She couldn't remember her very first tournament, but her first State Singles tournament was in Spokane in 1988. She finished third in Women's Class A. She averaged 17.53% in that tournament and had a high game of 31%. Thirteen women pitched in the 1988 State Tournament. In total, Carol has won 11 State Women's Championships, her first coming in 1997 in Kennewick. In a remarkable coincidence Art won his first State Singles Championship at that same tournament. Art recalls pitching in his very first tournament in 1975 at Lake Padden in Bellingham.

Some of their favorite courts to pitch on are Burlington, Olympia and Bellingham. Carol pitches a flip shoe, holding her shoe just to the right of center back, caulks down. She has always pitched Gordon horseshoes, even though some of her World Tournaments opponents looked on them with disdain when they saw what she was using. Their balance seems just right for her, so she hasn't used anything else. Her best game pitching the "rolling Gordons" was an 85% game in Bellingham, skunking her and Art's good friend Glen Heistand— a shame to do that to such a nice guy. Art used to pitch a 1 3/4 turn but now uses a 1 1/4 turn and pitches Imperial Horseshoes. He has won a state championship with both. Carol's most memorable game was memorable for all the wrong reasons. It was at a State Tournament in Burlington when she lost to Carol Bonds while pitching a 13% game. It was early in the morning and she couldn't get going at all, but it didn't help that the scorekeeper kept commenting on her many misses. But she came back the next day and skunked Carol Bonds in the second game of the double round robin, pitching 78.57%. Her average over the two day tournament was 53.06%. Carol likes horseshoes because it is a form of exercise that she can continue doing as the years go by. She had to learn to be competitive, but has come to enjoy that aspect of the game too. Art and Carol enjoy the people, and have made many friends through the years. It's not quite the same as the "old days" though, when so many of us spent tournament weekends at the courts in our RVs. We had evenings, happy hours, pot lucks and musical entertainment. There were several good musicians among the pitchers and their wives. I know there are some musicians among us now, but they keep it mighty quiet. Art has pitched in 37 State Tournaments and about 15 World Tournaments. Carol has pitched in 22 State Tournaments, and 12 World Tournaments. She won Women's Class G in Gillette WY one year. To the question, tell us something about yourself nobody knows, she said, "I was a miserable math student." "I was a good student in all other subjects." Her weakness in math kept her from pursuing a scientific career. As an elementary teacher, she taught a lot of science to 5th & 6th graders, among other subjects, and was very understanding to those students who had trouble with math.

I bet even Gene Kuiken couldn't come up with an excuse that these former school teachers haven't heard before.

The Flat-Out Truth About Plateaus... According to Clay and Sandy Pitts

Clay Pitts was at his club practice one night. A few of his fellow pitchers were sitting around talking. One of the guys who had a lot of experience was telling him that pitchers have times when their games "plateau" for a period of time, then they start progressing again until they hit another plateau. As Clay was listening to this veteran pitcher explain this phenomenon, he started taking a mental inventory of his own pitching history. His game



had been improving slowly but steadily, his ringer percentage was edging upward, he was placing in a few tournaments, and even winning one now and then. He wondered if what the old guy was telling him about plateaus was true.

He went home that night and was discussing the topic with his wife, Sandy. Before they went to bed that night, Sandy said, "Clay, don't forget the wise words of your mentor, Rusty Stake. He used to tell you a man with an experience is never at the mercy of a man with an argument." After that, Clay didn't think much more about it.

Fast forward a few months. The funny thing about plateaus is, you don't know you're on one ,until you've been there for a while. Sure enough, Clay looked back on a few months and tournaments, and saw that his ringer percentage was hovering at a certain place, and even regressing now and then. Exasperated, a couple thoughts came to him. The first was, "maybe this is what I am, and where I'm going to stay." The second was, "maybe what I need is a horseshoe pitchers extreme makeover, just like those television shows." Sandy told him to stay away from those two extremes, and he'd probably be just fine. She told him, "You don't have any serious flaws in your delivery, so just keep grinding and stay the course."

Ultimately, Clay decided to make a couple tweaks in his game. He slowed his arm speed, worked on a smoother follow through, and finally, made sure his stride was not sabotaging everything his upper body was doing, and sure enough soon he was back on track.

Clay told Sandy, "I'm finding this crazy game of horseshoes is a heck of a lot like mountain climbing, where you spend as much time moving horizontally as vertically." Sandy laughed and said, "well you know dear, a famous mountain climber once said, when it's been a long day of climbing, and I feel like I can't go any farther, I concentrate on the next three feet, then the next three feet, then the next three feet, and pretty soon, I'm at the top." Clay said, "you're right sweetie, but you'll have to ask Russ Phillips what the view is like from up there, I'm still dodging these lousy plateaus half way up the mountain."


