

Guess What? We call it Horseshoe Pitching

Men and women off all ages and sizes converge on a little acre of iron stobs stuck down in mud with tiny cement sidewalks and they lob iron horseshoes back and forth, back and forth, back and forth for two to three hours. They interrupt their walking every 20 minutes or so to lob with someone else but they don't talk except to an accountant sitting near by who won't talk back...that is probably 'cause they paid the accountant to be quiet just before they commenced to lobbing. They seem intent on lobbing iron 'shoes to get close to or touch the stob and they get real joyous when a shoe goes around the stob like a ring. They speak about "shooting", "dead" and shout in anger at the accountant nearly every time they pick up the shoes they threw away. You can tell it isn't a test to see how far they can throw them 'shoes, or how high, or how long they can keep it up...it appears they throw 'em away, pick 'em up and throw them away again and again until the accountant has had enuf and makes 'em stop.

Some throw their shoes by grabbing it by the right leg while others grab it by the left leg. Some spin their 'shoes real fast, round and round, some spin 'em slow and a bunch of them flipflop 'em...so there don't appear to be any rules on anything except that they always gotta throw from the same spot they started from on the first throw. Old geezers, all women and every kid starts throwing 10 ft. closer than men who start next to a stob and aim at hitting another stob 40 ft. away. People are walking back and forth, paying no attention or keeping up with other people next to them throwing at other stobs. Sometimes they get mixed up and call a "judge" to figger out which 'shoe is which.

The mud gets hot and they splash water on it to cool it down after each fight. Then they figure out the water made it too messy for the 'shoes and they use a shovel to cover up the mess with drier mud. Seems they all make the same stupid mistake when they change to a different pair of stobs.

The accountants make out a report card and takes it to the head accountant who had collected money from everyone that came to throw 'shoes. After two to or three hours of strenuous exercise, the accountants declare they won't work any more and everyone waits for the head accountant to give the money back. But apparently good behavior pays off, 'cause the head accountant only pays back about half of the people who paid in the first place.

The people shake hands before fighting and when they finish fighting...but they never shake hands with the accountant or the "judge". The accountants keep the tips people bribe them with and don't share none with the "judges" or their boss., the head accountant. You can figure the head accountant kept the money from some that didn't get paid back, but how the "judge" gets any money is hard to figure.

Everyone has a tiny suitcase or sturdy bag that they use to carry two to four 'shoes, a file, a measuring stick and some other things like lipstick, suntan oil, band aids, etc. And lots of people with bad backs have a 'hook' to pick up 'shoes with out paining their back. Spectators sit there like tennis fans, turning their heads from side to side. Happiness is bliss...and these people lobbing horseshoes seem to be full of bliss before and after a days' workout lobbing 'shoes. they do this thing about every weekend and sometimes on evenings during the week. they seem to be a healthy lot so the exercise must do them real good...guess they have good reason to be full of bliss.

Art Sperber's My most memorable? I've got a bunch – for various reasons. Here are a five of them. 1) I was playing at Pleasanton, CA, in the Championship Division against Art Tyson of New York. We were having a tight game and the sound of our "4-deads" following the smack of our ringers in the clay was almost constant. (I equaled my best with 26 consecutive ringers.) As I completed my half of another "4-Dead" I heard a voice in the stands say, "I wish I could capture that sound and take it home." I turned slightly because the voice sounded familiar and saw that it was Winnie Winetrout!

- 2) In Columbus, Ohio, I was playing in the Intermediate Division (60-65) and had one more win to a likely championship. I was loose and confident, throwing ringer after ringer against a good pitcher from Missouri. I realized the score was 35-0 and I felt bad that my opponent hadn't scored. Well, I pitched the second shoe to the side of the stake. My opponent proceeded to score 3 points. I was pleased, until he went on pitching double after double until the score was 35-20! I finally pitched a win, but told myself never to do that again!
- 3) During my early pitching years I played at about 65% and entered a Portland tournament. I started against Lowell Davis who was a pretty good pitcher, but I thought, during my practice, "I can beat that guy!" The score ended 26-50, with Lowell pitching 80%. Then I pitched three others from Oregon and they all beat me with 80% or better!
- 4) Later, in that same Portland tournament, I played Bob West an outstanding National Hall of Fame pitcher. I played toe to toe with him and even led him at the mid-point. I wasn't missing much and had my first 13 consecutive doubles game. As we played, I noticed no one else was pitching they were waiting on our game to finish and wondering if I could beat the Hall of Famer! Well, I froze up and lost, but it certainly was a memorable game!
- 5) (As told to me. About a former Kitsap pitcher, the late Burl Matteson)

Burl was keeping score, an obligation of all dedicated pitchers. The day was long, the weather cool, and the lower division pitchers were tired, scoring either 1 point or nothing. Burl dutifully recorded their pitiful efforts until finally, as he looked around and saw everyone else was finished, he exclaimed, "Hell, you guys don't need a scorekeeper. You need practice!" Having said that he laid the scoreboard down and went home! (You know, I couldn't blame him!)



These changes will be voted on at the annual state 2009 state meeting

CHANGES TO CONSTITUTION – WSHPA

Article IV (Officers)

Add Regional Director to appointed officers.

Officers shall take office – delete(immediately upon election or appointment) add (as of January 1st of the year following the State Tournament elections.

Article V (Duties of Officers) End of Section I: add - including a Medical Exemption Committee Chair Person.

Section II: add - The Vice President shall also chair the Honor Roll Committee and be in charge of securing judges at the State Tournament. The 2nd Vice President shall oversee the Jr. Promotion committee. The 3rd Vice President shall oversee the Promotion Committee and be in charge of scorekeepers at the State Tournament. All the Vice Presidents shall assist the Tournament Director of the State Tournament in any way needed.

Section IV: Delete – (the Secretary shall determine tournament scheduling).....thru....(distribution of plates and plaques.)

Section V: 1st paragraph – delete word – (quarterly) – before financial reports. 2nd paragraph – after showing the status of all funds – delete (at the close of each month) – add (at his request).

Section VI: Delete (The statistician shall provide mailing labels to the newsletter Editor each month.) Delete (and to the National Newsline Editor.) After – record of each tournament to the..delete..(secretary) add (Plaque Person,) for determining, etc. The Statistician shall... delete (promote communication) add (communicate) between, etc.


Add Section VII – The duties of the Regional Director shall be to determine tournament scheduling for the coming year, issue tournament Sanctions and obtain for distribution NHPA tournament patches. The Regional Director shall perform any other duties to promote the State Association and be a liaison for the NHPA and follow the guidelines laid out for the Regional Director by the NHPA.

Add Section VIII – A plate and plaque person shall be appointed by the President. The person appointed shall maintain plate and plaque records and also be responsible for the procurement and distribution of plates and plaques.

Article VI Charters: Correct spelling – change notify to notifying.

Article VIII Meetings:shall call a meeting of Executive Board..delete (at least once each calendar year quarter) add (a minimum of two times each year).

These changes will be presented for discussion and approval by the general membership at the 2009 State meeting.
