Horseshoe pitchers understand sportsmanship. The rules are few, easily understood and intuitive. New pitchers or those new to organized pitching are sometimes unaware of a rule but once understood, rules violations seldom occur. Horseshoe pitchers in general are honest and trustworthy people. They understand and obey the rules.

Using a tactic of accusing an opponent of stepping over the foul line is a clear violation of the rules. (See Section B Enforcing Violations) below.

Section B – Enforcing Violations

1. Enforced by Judge

The following are rules violations that must be spotted and called by an assigned judge. The penalty is to declare the shoe a foul shoe.

(a) *Any shoe pitched when the contestant, during the delivery, has stepped on or over the foul line before releasing the shoe.*

When warming up before a game, if a pitcher is consistently stepping over the foul line a mention is appropriate, but during a game the correct remedy for foul line violations is to call it to the attention of a judge. To harass a player by telling him or her that he or she is stepping over the foul line is unsportsmanlike and falls under the definition of 'heckling' which is punishable by expulsion from the tournament\league\NHPA. Notify your Tournament Director if anyone accuses you of 'stepping over the foul line' during a game.

Fortune seems to have smiled on the WSHPA up to this point in having decent weather during our tournaments. The Winetrouts went off without a hitch with good attendance. 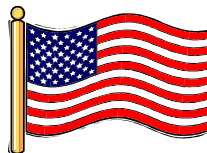

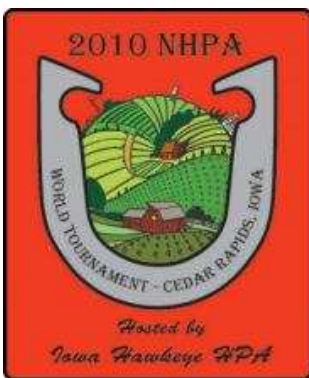
Ed:

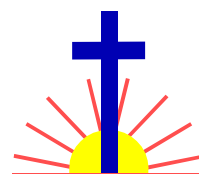

See his article and description of the events depicted in the picture on page 8. The late forties through the sixties was probably the heyday of horseshoe pitching in the US.

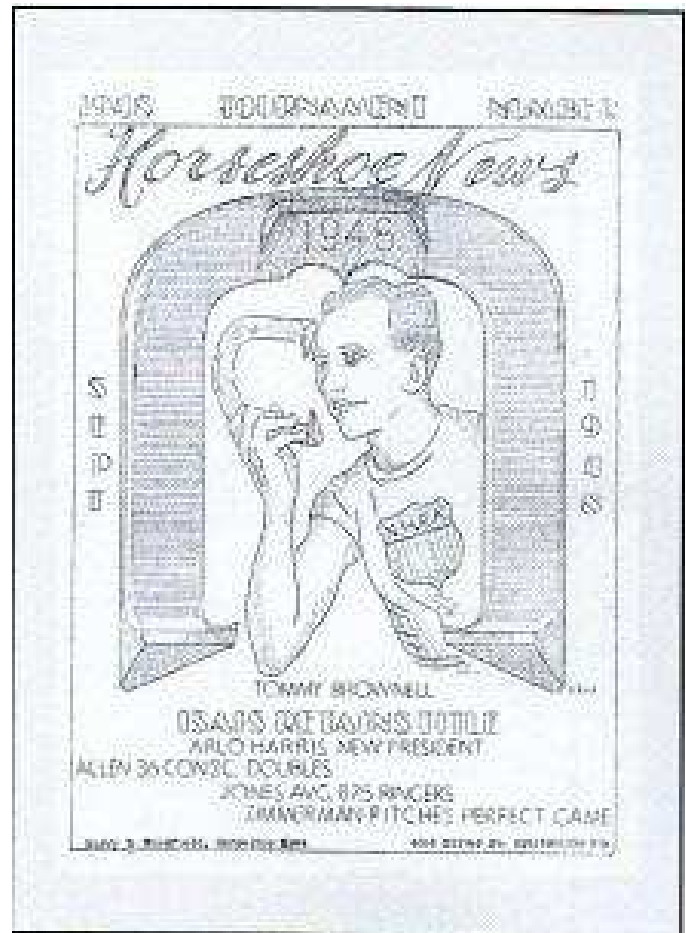
This article commemorates so many of the horseshoe pitching greats that it deserves to be highlighted especially since some of those mentioned come from the Northwest.

Have you made plans yet to attend the 2010 NHPA World Tournament July 26 – August 7 in Cedar Rapids Iowa?

The Cedar Rapids Ice Arena will be the site of the 2010 World Tournament. The entire competition will be held under one roof and 50 courts will be built on two rinks.

Finals will be held in the hockey arena where spectators will enjoy the soft seats and excellent viewing. Free parking is available in lots circling the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena.

NHPA Board Members Dick Hansen and Jerry LaBrosse and their wives toured the facility in late October and advised the local host committee on the best way to set up the space for the World Tournament. The Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association has been hard at work ever since to plan for a quality and fulfilled experience for all participating pitchers and their families!

Your host committee has selected three hotels for those participating in the tournament. All 3 hotels are a 5 minute drive to the ice arena! Also located by the hotels are Perkins, Happy Chef, Pei's Chinese Restaurant, Metro Buffet, Synergy Restaurant *at the Clarion Hotel*, Sonic Drive-in, McDonalds, Burger King, and Taco Bell. 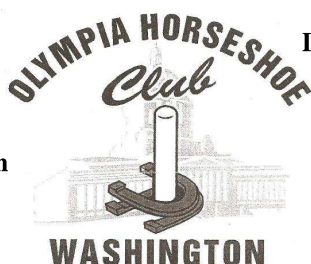

Horseshoe Pitching Facts and Folklore *by Bob Dunn*

This cover picture from 1948 just may be the most historic NHPA magazine cover ever. That's a lot to say, as there have been countless great covers, including U.S. presidents and horseshoe pitching notables. This cover tells of some incredible headlines of the day and also highlights an incredible competitive era of our sport.

Notice the cover itself, a rather homemade looking; amateur produced book. This was a two-year period where the NHPA news magazine did not have the professional look as the decades prior through the Horseshoe World, or the decades that followed through The Horseshoe Pitcher, Horseshoe Pitchers' News Digest and today's Newline. The Horseshoe News was the individual effort by then NHPA president and Hall of Fame member, Harry "Pop" Woodfield. During 1947, 1948 and part of 1949, the Horseshoe News produced off an old-fashioned mimeograph machine; was the only communication for the NHPA members. A little known fact about Mr. Woodfield is that he was responsible for constructing horseshoe pitching courts on the White House lawn during the Truman administration.

The first headline that caught the reader's eye was: Ted Allen 36 consecutive doubles in the World tournament competition. Everyone knows that the great feat of 72 consecutive ringers was accomplished by Allen in 1955 against Cletus Chapelle. Actually, Allen accomplished the feat twice, first in 1948; but over two games. Allen ended one game with 29 consecutive doubles then started the next game with 7 double ringers.

The next headline is the record setting performance by Casey Jones, averaging 87.5% and not winning the championship. In fact, Jones lost three games in that 1948 World Tournament, held in his home state of Wisconsin.

Then, Guy Zimmerman pitched a perfect 44 shoe game, believed to be the first perfect game in a World Tournament.

Isais was named in the headlines, for winning the world's championship in one of the most competitive eras, but probably next to the most competitive era of our sport. This was Isais' third title as he went on to win eight titles in all.

Now looking back, those items weren't really the big news of the day; Arlo Harris elected president is by far the most newsworthy. A whole book could be written about Harris, his efforts and his impact to the NHPA. Ever notice how the NHPA has a league program and league participation that is equal to and maybe even greater than tournament involvement. It hasn't always been that way. Prior to Arlo, the NHPA was strictly tournament pitcher oriented. While there always have been leagues and town teams, as far back as 1919, those pitchers were not all NHPA members. Harris had plans to change all that and to bring in "count-all scoring". While there was no great success during his term, it was a major thrust of the movement and culminated as Donnie Roberts drafted out the first guidelines of the NHPA Sanctioned League Program, 30 years later. Today, league players out-number tournament pitchers, a fact that would seem improbable in the 1920's or 1950's.

Tommy Brownell is pictured on the cover. For those who may never have heard of Brownell, he is one of the three players to defeat Casey Jones in 1948. And in 1955, when Ted Allen again had 36 consecutive doubles (all in a single game), in a different game, he matched up against Allen, to mark a new record of 50 four-deads in a single game. Brownell's accomplishments are not limited to World Tournaments. He was a six time New York State Champion.





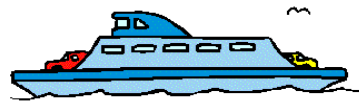
