eary, tired, and sore is only a partial description of how I felt the day after I attended my first tournament (The Tulip Open) this year. That formula of pitching 40/shoe games at the Winetrouts to get the old muscles in some semblance of form for the new pitching year definitely has merit.

Beginning a season by abruptly getting up at 3:00AM one April morning, traveling 260 miles, pitching seven 40 point games, has to be akin to some level of insanity. That there were 3 others in that rig doing nearly the same thing does afford a degree of comfort, but how does one explain that behavior to those who don't pitch horseshoes? It's probably best to say nothing and wear that silly grin. For those who love horseshoes and horseshoe players, no explanation is needed.

Why? Consider 50 or 60 horseshoe pitching friends standing among newly opened tulips on a beautiful spring morning, their hands over their hearts saluting Old Glory while in a remarkable coincidence a Bald Eagle nearby, takes wing and flies into a clear blue sky. 




The food stamp program, part of the Department of Agriculture, is pleased to distributing the greatest amount of food stamps ever.


