attended my first horseshoe tournament in 8 months on April 11th. It was the Tulip Open, and I didn't go as a participant, only as an observer, but it was very therapeutic for me to be back at the courts. Two things were predictable from the start. The first was that the weather was going to be unpredictable, and the other was that it was going to be tough on this day if you happen to be a high shoe pitcher. Tournament Director, Jon Turnbull, decided to hold off the start, while a small rain shower passed through, but then things went on as scheduled in one flight, for the remainder of the day. The sun broke out for long stretches throughout the day, and when it did, it felt good on the old bones.

A long time friend of mine, who I hadn't seen for a couple of years, met me in the morning and we sat together as I explained to him all the nuances and activity that was taking place out on the courts.

At one point during the day, we decided to move our chairs to another location, and while we were walking there, I told my friend to set his chair down while I made a restroom stop. When I got back, he told me he had been watching the pitcher with the white hair and the green jacket pitch, and he had made ringers on like nine out of ten (Continued on page 4)

shoes! I told him that Russ does that a lot, and that's why he is one of the best horseshoe pitchers in the world.

It was interesting to hear some of the impressions of someone who had no real connections to the game of horseshoes. He told me he thought the courts and grounds were beautiful, and he was also surprised at how many different ways the pitchers pitch their shoes. He was also impressed with the opening meeting we have before each tournament, how everybody gets a chance to say something, and then our group singing of the National Anthem and an opening prayer for a good and safe day. It can be very useful sometimes for us to get an outsiders impression of what we do. By about 1 pm my friend, who lives in Lake Stevens had to leave, and I was left to gather some of my own impressions as an insider. I'm always impressed by the great work our tournament directors do at our clubs all across the state. I know all the clubs work hard to put on great tournaments, sometimes with a limited amount of help. Let me assure you the pitchers appreciate your efforts. Thank you to those who help with the scorekeeping. At least one that I know of was doing it for the first time, Vicki Johnson. Great job Vicki. Margaret Byfield and Carol Turnbull did their usual great job at the score table. Thanks also to Lorriane Koistinen and the other ladies who served up a great lunch.

Out on the courts Russ Phillips was the class A Champion and the overall Tournament Champion. In Class B, number one and two seeds Harry Dawson and Lee Shinn both went to the last game of the day undefeated and Lee edged Harry 26-22 for the Class B title. Willis Mott and Gary Shinpaugh won Classes C and D with perfect 6/0 records, while Class E was won by Brian Berntsen of Omak after a playoff with Terry Hanson.

Finally, thanks to those who stayed around after to help with the teardown and cleanup, and that was many of you. At the end of a long day, that can be hard to do, but those helping hands are a welcome sight to our host clubs, and let's face it, it's just the right thing to do.

I don't know if you've noticed, but we have a couple of new pitchers from Omak, who are making a little noise on the courts. In the Tulip Open, Brian Berntsen took first place in Class E, and Robert Christianson took third. They followed that up in the Columbia Basin Open with Brian taking fourth in Class C and Robert winning Class D with a 5-1 record. Keep up the good pitching guys!

The Columbia Cup

We have a number of new pitchers this year who may not be aware of the Columbia Cup competition. Since 1999, Washington and Oregon horseshoe pitchers have competed annually for the Columbia Cup trophy. How does the competition work? Each time Oregon and Washington pitchers face each other in tournaments in either state, points are accumulated for the state whose pitcher won the game. This starts as early as the Winetrouts in January and ends at the Pacific Northwest Open in Yakima in September. I believe Vey Allen compiles the points during the season, and each year's champion is awarded at the Pacific Northwest Open. Washington leads the all time series 10-6. It's a wonderful opportunity for friendly competition between our Northwest neighbors and a chance to meet and compete against new pitchers and most importantly make some new friends.




