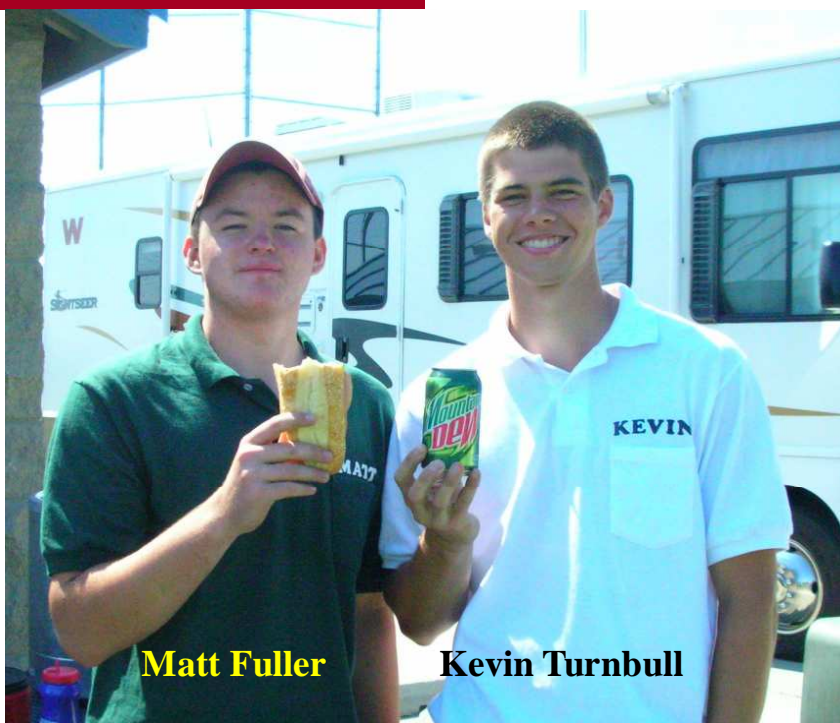

Four Turkeys

If the results from the Goldendale Turkey shoot seem somewhat skewed, it's because three out of the four turkeys shown here had endured an experiment in handicapping.

The one that Don was holding had lost his head, but the other three had to put up with a tournament director who discovered that classes could be easily handicapped using the HS Master program. Deciding to even the score somewhat in classes that had over a 10% spread an 80% handicap was stirred into the mix in classes A, C, D, E.

It did change the outcome of the classes somewhat, but no-one suffered damage equal to the bird. He will undoubtedly be part of a traditional thanksgiving dinner.

There were enough turkeys to pay down three places in the five six person classes with a few left over for make up prizes.

For the second year in a row, the Quists got away to Bellingham without the turkey they had won in the competition. Last years bird remained in the freezer until this year when he

was thawed and became part of this year's celebration in Franks roasting pan.

Kevin Turnbull age 18 graduated from Sedro-Woolley High School. He learned to play horseshoes from both his father, Jon Turnbull and Gene Kuiken, practicing at the Burlington horseshoe pits. He used Deadeye EZ Grips to pitch a 11/4 turn. His national average is currently 17.34%. Kevin has played a total of five years with Bakersfield, California in 2006, being the last World Tournament he attended, in which he took home first place in the division D class of the junior boys and girls. He had 11.5 wins and 1.5 losses. Kevin believed "it was a great tournament, except it was too hot...I got heat stroke." He enjoyed winning his class but not at the cost of a heat stroke. His most fun experience was when "Yancy, Buddy, three other people and I went searching for a saber-toothed kangaroo." He recommends that to improve your game you need to "focus, don't concentrate". Kevin believes that what made his horseshoe experience so interesting is all the "great people" who are "very fun to talk to and lots of interesting stories"

Kory Reeves age 17 recently graduated Shadle Park High School. He dislikes an "environment that doesn't allow one to have fun...school". Kory's favorite activities other than horseshoes include skateboarding and language studies. He first learned how to play horseshoes from John McCarthy and practiced at Spokane's Franklin Park. During his first year he attended his first horseshoe tournament in Yakima (Northwest) in 2007, where he took 3rd place. Kory pitches with Gordon Multigrips and uses the 3/4 turn. Recently, Kory attended the 2008 Washington State Horseshoe Tournament that took place in Kennewick where he started with a 21.64% average and came out with an average of 27.32%. Kory believed the tournament to be "a lot of fun" and it had many "nice and new people to meet". Kory looks up to Matt Fuller as a horseshoe hero because he believes Matt to be "a really good guy...my only real junior competition."
