WSHPA Executive Board Meeting Minutes, 9-5-09

At Burlington State Tournament

The meeting was called to order by President Don Davis. The minutes of the previous Executive Board meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Read by Treas. Margaret Byfield, and approved. August 2008 – July 2009

Beginning Balance: \$4467.90 Received \$20,382.55 Expenses \$19,285.26 Current Balance \$5,565.19

Committee Reports

Promotions: Chairman Jon Turnbull reported that he has tried to contact Ch. 5, but has had no response. The Skagit Club's horsehoe float has been used in local parades. A new idea: Have a business tournament with local businesses entering teams. Cost, for example, would be \$100 per team with full payback. This idea would get local people out to your courts and introduce them to our sport.

NHPA promotions sent word to local newspapers regarding pitchers from the area who would be participating in the World Tournament. Reporters followed-up with articles in Spokane, Kitsap, and Auburn newspapers. The Spokane Club works with a handicapped group. Four of these pitched with them on their league nights.

Jr. Promotions: Phyl Quist reported that the WSHPA was able to provide each of our juniors \$600 to go to the Springfield World Tournament. She thanked Jon and Don for their effort in making the auction a success. A brochure showing what our Jr. Program offers is available. Trophies for juniors are also available. Junior Hall of Fame: There was one late submission, so there is no inductee this year.

Hall of Fame: Vic Magnus will be chairman next year. Pres. Don appointed Phyl Quist and Jon Turnbull to the committee.

Regional Director: Vey Allen presented the 2010 proposed tournament schedule. He asked clubs to check it over to verify the information.

Editor: Jim Link reported his concern about the high price of toner. He has some ideas that will cut costs.

Honor Roll: Paul Tutewiler reported that awards for this year are prepared. For 2010 he wants clubs or individuals to submit names of anyone in your club who does the extra 10%.

World Tournament: Phyl announced that the 2010 World Tournament will be in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. This year's World in Springfield, Illinois, was the 2nd largest in participation. Next year's schedule may change due to the increased number in the Elders Class. Some Elders may pitch in the first week. It was determined that a pitcher must be there at the start time or he or she will be dropped. (There will be no forfeit of a game.)

National Horseshoe Pitching Day: Clubs are encouraged to set up courts in parking lot, school grounds, etc. to have horseshoe pitching out where it can be seen. There will be more information on this later.

The NHPF Hall of Fame Museum and grounds are a great facility. Phyl has taken many pictures and will display them soon.

Old Business

Hall of Fame Trailer for Fairs Committee: Chairman Jim Link wants ideas for this. He talked about State Fairs, setting up portable courts, etc. Cindy Reeves, Spokane, mentioned that she has ties with the YMCA and will have a booth to promote horseshoes. Pres. Don likes the Fair idea. He says that we need parents with kids and families are at the fairs. It was suggested that we need to start planning with the fair people a year in advance. A question was asked regarding how to get the Hall of Fame trailer to a tournament. The response was that a "networking program" is needed to take it around – must have someone to haul it, return it, or store it.

Reminder of Fees Due: Last year a motion was passed to pay the WSHPA \$2.00 per player in a tournament for maintaining the Hall of Fame trailer and the state website.

This will be added to the form for Tournament Directors and will be published in the *Shoes News*.

New Business

Budget: Treas. Margaret Byfield presented the 2010 budget which was approved.

Jr. Bylaws: Phyl Quist presented the changes and additions. Archie Silcox moved to accept these. The motion was seconded by Paul Tutewiler and approved. The new bylaws will be printed.

Webmaster: Rhonda Davis will be the new WSHPA Webmaster, replacing Larry Lewis.

Tournament Formats: Gene Kuiken discussed his dislike of driving a long distance for just 5 games. Tournament directors were encouraged to have 8-man classes when possible. It was mentioned that low turn-outs result in a percentage spread that is too great. The final word was to ask your Tournament Director to accommodate you as best he or she can in the circumstances.

Percentage Spread in State Tournaments: An idea suggested: If there is more than a 10% spread in a group take out the top % pitcher to make it a fair to the rest of the class.

(This was done in the top Womens' Class at this tournament.)

Discussion: If we had a larger number of pitchers it would work as is. Most realize the unfairness and frustration, but some would prefer to pitch against the better pitchers anyway. A motion was made and passed to adjourn the meeting.




