Robert Leslie Clark, 76, died Sept. 7, 2014, after a tough battle with Lewy Body Disease. He was born on April 28, 1938, in Gouldsboro, Maine, to Arthur and Edith Clark.

Robert graduated from Sumner High

School in Maine and moved to Connecticut for a manufacturing job.

After a short first marriage, He married Natalie Kimball and later moved to Washington in 1969.

He worked at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton and retired in 1993.

In 1991, Robert played an important role in the designing and construction of the horseshoe courts at South Kitsap Regional Park.

In 2008, he was inducted into the Washington State Horseshoe Pitcher's Hall of Fame for his dedication to improvement and recruiting for the game.

Survivors include his wife, Natalie; daughters Gail, Bonnie, Diane and Tina; son, Peter; 14 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

In lieu of flowers, donation in memory of Bob Clark can



WSHPA General Meeting August 31,2014 State Tournament, Kennewick

The meeting was called to order by President Don Davis; The secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting and they were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> Rhonda Davis presented her annual report.

Bank of America Checking \$3,262.11; Bank of America Savings #1 \$7,531.72; Bank of America Savings #2 \$6,142.67

Washington Federal CDs -#1 \$5,093.22 #2 \$5,093.22 #3 \$53,533.04

Inventory Value: (Horseshoes and notions) \$6,610.30; Junior Promotion Fund \$1,036.90

Membership: 143 members this year (Down 7 from last year) 127 adults, 16 juniors, 32 associates

It was moved and seconded to accept the report. Motion approved.

<u>State Tournament</u> President Don asked the Kennewick members to stand and accept our thanks for a fine tournament. He says he appreciates the clay courts and thanks them for their work putting in and maintaining the clay.

<u>Promotion</u> Jon Turnbull says he found that it would be too expensive to have a booth at one of the fairs. The Skagit Club had their local newspaper come in and do a feature about their club and the facility. It even included a video on the newspaper's website. (Look up skagit.com and search for "Horseshoe Pitching" for the great article and video.) It brought people in. Other clubs should try to have a promotions director work with their newspaper. It will help.

<u>Junior Promotion</u> Phyl Quist reported that Washington had 3 juniors participate in the 2014 World Tournament: Karla Lewis, Michael and Patrick McCarthy. Our juniors always do an awesome job and we're proud of them. The Junior Board determines the amount given each junior for World Tournament expenses. This year it was \$600 because it was long trip across the country. The fund now has a total of \$905. Phyl thanked Art Sperber for his continual donations to the fund, and also thanked Jon and Don for their antics at the auction. The junior numbers are growing. There are two new juniors in Bellingham. Phyl commends all our adult members for supporting the juniors. She will get used trophies made up for junior awards at tournaments. Juniors enjoy getting a trophy. Jim and Phyl will step down from heading the Junior Committee on January 1, and they hope someone will come forward to take their place. President Don pointed out that Phyl does many things and suggests that anybody who wants to help our group by helping her out to please come forward.

<u>Regional Director</u> Vic Magnus has prepared the draft for the 2014 Tournament Schedule. He asks clubs to check it over and report back to him. He wants it finalized by December.

<u>World Tournament</u> Phyl Quist reported that she and Don were delegates this year. The Spokane bid for 2016 did not succeed. Alabama and Spokane were the two top vote-getters, but Spokane lost in the second ballot. Spokane wants to bid again. The system for bidding may change. In the current format most states have already made up their minds before the presentations are made. Ideas to be considered are to alternate the areas of sites - west, central, east - and it may change to a board decision, rather than a delegate vote. Phyl presented her idea that if none of these things came about that the site be in the Pacific Time Zone every 4 years.

We had 7 representatives from Washington. John McCarthy Jr. and Michael McCarthy won their classes, Patrick McCarthy was 2nd in the Cadet Championship, Bonnie was 3rd in her class, And Russ was 4th in the Elders Championship.

It was a good tournament, but tiring for the Quists who worked at the National Hall of Fame Booth. There were 4 web cameras this year. Next year there will be 18, showing all courts. Donations are needed for the cameras use. \$100 for one camera or a few dollars to help.

NEW BUSINESS

Executive Board Report Carol Sperber read a summary of actions and discussions from the Executive Board meeting.

Comments followed regarding the Davenport Fair horseshoe tournament: It is held on the 3rd weekend in August. The Lincoln County Fair, and the Waterville Fair also have horseshoe tournaments. Information on these should be sent to the *Shoes News*. Vic Magnus encourages WSHPA pitchers who take part in these to promote us, not just go and pitch.

2015 State Doubles Bids were made by the Columbia Basin Club, Kennewick, and the Yakima Club. Kennewick was the winner. It will be held in October with their fall tournament. Vic says that the Clover Island Inn will hold the same prices for us next year.

2015 State Singles Skagit Valley Club, Burlington, was the only bid, and was selected.

Election of Officers

1st Vice-President - Nominations were Dennis Tutewiler and Nick Nicholson. Dennis was elected.

3rd Vice-President - Monty McLaughlin was re-elected.

Pres. Don announced that he will not run again next year.

State Singles Entry Change Don and Rhonda suggest using an entry format like that for the World Tournament. A form would be published in the Shoes News which would need to be completed and sent in with payment by a certain date. Phyl Quist moved that the "by paper entry form", dated by August 1, be used for the 2015 State Singles Tournament. The motion was seconded by John McCarthy. Discussion: This may make it more difficult to get in. Every club should remind all members of this requirement. Once it gets started it should work well. The forms will be available at tournaments and can be mailed by August 1. The motion passed.

<u>State Doubles Format</u> President Don suggest "bar league rules" be used. This would be non-walking doubles. It may be a way to get more pitchers to try our tournaments. It simplifies the game a bit. It would be 21 points, cancellation. To be sanctioned we would have to track a ringer percentage. Participating in two tournaments prior to the Doubles

would be required. The majority raised their hands, agreeing to give it a try. Don will come up with the final plan for this.

Hall of Fame Trailer The trailer has been parked at Margaret Byfield's home this year. and needs a new parking place. Vic says there will be a place in Kennewick for the winter at the Stumpf home.

<u>Statistician</u> Jerry Conklin brought up the point that in the State Tournament a play-off must be a complete 40-shoe game. Vic pointed out that for other tournaments a play-off has to be at least 1/2 a complete game and the tournament director should announce it at the beginning of the tournament.

International Grandparents' Fund Phyl reported that this fund is not bringing in more people to the tournaments where drawings have been made. Committee members Vic Magnus, Carol Sperber, Phyl and Jim Quist met and decided that Odessa will be the last individual tournament for these awards. Next year the awards will be given at the State Tournament. There will be 4 - 5 drawings for \$50 or more

Washington Shirts Phyl can take orders for the white shirts with the Washington logo on the back. The cost is now \$30.

<u>State Tournament Format</u> Don introduced Jon Turnbull's idea of having a move-up system for this tournament. Groups would pitch on Saturday and Sunday, and those who move-up would play on Monday. This may be a way to give the lower pitchers a chance to move up. It will be checked-out, and if it works with our By-Laws the Executive Board can consider it.

<u>Pitcher-of-the-year Awards</u> Rhonda Davis first acknowledged those who came in close, the Honorable Mention pitchers: Jerry Conklin, Lee Zalesney, Gene Kuiken, Stan Speers, Ron McLaughlin, Glen Heistand, and Sharon McLaughlin. The winners were:

1st - Charlie Tapper \$100/2nd - Monty McLaughlin \$75 / 3rd - Russ Phillips \$50

Charlie challenged anyone to take first place away from him next year.

<u>Plaques</u> First-time plaques were awarded to George Reynolds, Lee Davis, Cindy Clausen, and Paul Burkhard. Paid-for plaques were distributed to Loren Totusek, Jon Turnbull, Russ Phillips, Ray Powell, Nick Nicholson, and Charlie Tapper.

<u>Hall of Fame</u> Phyl Quist, chairman, presented the awards. The chairman for next year will be Russ Phillips. Send in your write-ups by the first of May. There were 5 nominations this year. The 2 not inducted will stay in consideration for two years. Inductees were:

Hollis Morris He was one of the original organizers of the Tri-Cities Club in 1986. He has served 10 years as the president of the club. He is always helping where and when needed and actively assists in many ways. Hollis has been a strong promoter, always looking for ways to increase membership. He has secured ads for the *Shoes News*, and introduced 4 of his grand-sons into horseshoes. He took part in 10 World Tournaments. In accepting the award, Hollis suggested that we follow his 20-year habit of carrying horseshoe club business cards with us to pass out to any interested persons we might meet.

Don and Rhonda Davis The Hall of Fame Committee received a "strange letter" to nominate these two. It spoke of Don's strong leadership as president and his three state championships. Rhonda has impressed everyone with her scorekeeping - the best, and her bookkeeping is second to none. Don thanked Russ for his "eloquent" letter. He thanked the organization, and added. "My uncle (Ed Fishel) is someone I thought a lot of. To share this with him in the Hall of Fame trailer is one of the coolest things I've ever done."

Rhonda thanked everyone.

Silent Auction This auction raised \$220 for the Junior Fund.

The meeting was adjourned and followed by some great entertainment - songs by Nick Nicholson and recitations by Harold Boyer.

Executive Board Meeting August 30, 2014 State Tournament, Kennewick

The meeting was called to order by President Don Davis.

The Secretary read the minutes of the previous executive board meeting and they were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> Treas. Rhonda Davis presented her report for the year and it was approved. The following is a brief summary of the detailed report:

Washington Federal CDs #1 \$5,093.22, #2 \$5,093.22, #3 \$53,533.04

Total all accounts - \$80,655.98

Inventory Value (hats, round robin cards, score sheets, horseshoes, notions) \$6,610.30

Regarding the Washington Mutual cds: Since there has been no action on these, the bank called it "no activity", so wanted to turn it over to the state. Rhonda will sign papers to keep them active for another 3 years.

Committee Reports

<u>Promotion</u> Jon Turnbull reported that the idea of having a booth at one of the large fairs has been found to be too costly. The charge is from \$500 to \$1000 for a 10x10 area. No booths are permitted outside the fair facility area. Ron Heutink commented that the Davenport Fair has horseshoe pitching. Pres. Don asked Ron to get an announcement for that into the *Shoes News* next year. Waterville also has a tournament. Jon reported that the Skagit Club has an informative brochure that they will share with other clubs. They are thinking of making one for the state.

<u>Junior Promotion</u> Phyl Quist reported that the WSHPA has 11 active Juniors and Cadets this year, and a total of 15 registered in NatStats. So, Washington is doing better. Three Juniors went to the World tournament. Michael McCarthy won his class and Patrick McCarthy placed 2nd in the Cadets. The Jr. Committee determines the amount to provide for those Jrs. going to the World Tournament. This year it was \$600 each since it was a long trip.. That fund now has a balance of \$905. The Junior Committee members are Art Sperber, Dennis Tutewiler, Matt Fuller, Jim and Phyl Quist. Phyl thanked Art Sperber for his frequent contributions, and thanked Don and Jon for their "wonderful antics" that make the auction a success.

Regional Director Vic Magnus distributed the draft copy of the 2015 tournament schedule. It will be in the Shoes News. Let Vic know of changes or corrections. New Business

World Tournament Phyl Quist reported that Washing had 7 pitchers in the World Tournament in New York. Next year the tournament will be in Topeka, Kansas. Spokane lost the bid for 2016 on the second ballot to Alabama. The NHPA Executive Board is considering changing the way the site for a world tournament is chosen. One idea is to have it to have it on the east coast, the next year in the mid-section, then in the west. Another idea is to have the Executive Board decide, rather than putting it up for a vote.

<u>Jr. Committee Chairmanship</u> Phyl announced that she has been wearing too many hats recently and wants to ease her load. She and Jim will resign from the Jr. Committee at the end of the year and hope someone will step up and take over. She also wants someone else to take over the charge of the shirts and jackets for the state tournament. She will continue to do the plates and plaques.

<u>State Doubles</u> Nick Nicholson would like to see more shoes pitched in the state doubles tournament, and suggests 40 rather than 20. Pres. Don spoke of his plan to change this and will speak more about it at the General Meeting.

<u>Statistician</u> Jerry Conklin asks that score sheets be done in pencil only - no ball point pen. He scans sheets to archive them and colored pens do not show up. **State Tournament** Rhonda will have a new form for sign-ups next year and will require payment in advance.

<u>Club Directory</u> Carol Sperber has copies of these for new members. Let her know if you need them.

Since there was no more business and the wind was blowing a dusty gale, the meeting was adjourned.


