



WINETROUT WINTER OPEN RINGER CLASSIC

This series of 6 tournaments from January through March gives those of us who brave the elements, a chance to get our pitching skills up to a competitive level as early as possible. They also serve as a way to encourage our members to renew their state and national memberships in a timely fashion. The mileage trophy is awarded to the pitcher who has traveled the most miles, one way and competes in at least 5 of the series. The winner of the most improved percentage trophy must also compete in at least 5 of the series. Pitchers cannot win either trophy more than once. At the conclusion of the series, a mens, womens, and elders champion are named and presented with a plaque. Scoring for the Winetrouts is also a little different. Scoring consists of counting ringers only by each pitcher in games of 40 shoes. First pitch is alternating and class winners are determined by win/loss record.

Let's plan on dusting off our shoes and warming up for the 2017 season at the Winetrouts!

WSHPA GENERAL MEETING SEPTEMBER 4, 2016 ~ GOLDEN CORRAL, SPOKANE, WA

President Dennis Tutewiler called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

Phyl Quist read the minutes of the last general meeting. The minutes were approved as read.

Rhonda Davis gave the treasurer's report. The total of all our funds is \$79,282.76. Russ Phillips and Stan Speers conducted the audit and Russ reported all was good. The treasurer's report was approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PROMOTION: Jon Turnbull again asked each member to carry horseshoe cards and hand them out. Cindy Reeves said they do a horseshoe camp and workshop for handicapped kids through the YMCA. Nick Nicholson suggested doing a money tournament once a month.

JR. PROMOTION: Bonnie Lewis reported there were no entrants this year into the Jr. Hall of Fame. The two juniors went to Wonderland for their party this year. She will be contacting all former juniors and encouraging them to renew their membership.

WORLD TOURNAMENT: Don Davis said the tournament was great and encouraged all to attend the World next year at St. George, Utah. In 2018 the tournament will be in Florence, South Carolina.

RHONDA PRESENTED THE 2016 TOURNAMENT PITCHER OF THE YEAR AWARDS – Don Davis was 1st, Russ Phillips was 2nd and Charlie Tapper was 3rd.

DENNIS THANKED THE SPOKANE CLUB for their great work in hosting the State Tournament.

There was no Old Business.

Dennis reported that the Executive Board discussed the State Tournament setup and had voted to continue the 3 day Labor Day weekend schedule.

NEW BUSINESS:

Don Davis suggested changing the format for State in that all would come and qualify one day and then be put into classes for pitching and day 3 would be the top 8 or etc. for championship play. Much discussion was held. Vic Magnus pointed out that all sanctioned tournaments had to use Nat Stats percentages. No action was taken to change our format.

Also an idea to have a virtual horseshoe tournament was discussed. This could be used more as a practice tool. All good ideas.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

Election of Officers was held. The 1st V.P. and 3rd V.P. were up for re-election. Current 1st V.P., Don Ebey, declined his nomination. Barry Gentle, Gerald Stangland and Cindy Clausen were nominated. Barry Gentle was elected the new 1st V.P. Monty McLaughlin was re-elected by unanimous vote to remain 3rd V.P.

BIDS FOR 2017 STATE TOURNAMENT:

The Kitsap Horseshoe Club was the only bidder for the State Singles tournament and Bellingham was the only bidder for the State Doubles.

Phyl Quist presented a first time plaque to Cadet Melikai Orozco. There were 10 other first time plaques whose recipients were not present. There were also 5 plaques to be given out for additional earned plaques.

Phyl Quist read a heartfelt description of the early induction of Jerry Clark into the WSHPA Hall of Fame. This was presented to Jerry on April 21st of this year – a time when he was still able to appreciate how highly he was regarded by his horseshoe family.

Susan Clark has continued to publish the Shoes News and will till the end of the year. Larry Lewis has volunteered to take over in January.

Dennis asked if anyone was interested in the secretary position being held temporarily by Phyl. Bonnie Lewis volunteered and will become the new secretary, also as of January 1st.
