ANNUAL MEETING/STATE TOURNAMENT SUMMARY:

The 2023 Washington State Horseshoe Tournament, annual meeting and banquet were held in Olympia over the Labor Day weekend. The weather was fine and we had a really nice time together, despite Jon's computer entries with handicaps...Thanks to Bonnie Lewis's heartfelt encouragement to Jon and to Larry Lewis for saving him from total disgrace, correcting the entries.

This year's State Champions are: Elder class- Don Linbo, Men's class- Matt Fuller, Women's class- Cindy Clausen, and Cadet class, Jeremiah DeMello.

<u>CONGRATULATIONS to each of you</u> and thanks to everyone who participated by pitching, score keeping, prepping the courts, and supporting our horseshoe family.

Below is a summarized version of the report by State Treasurer and Secretary, Rhonda, from our general meeting...

Although membership increased by 8 this year, we are down 55% over the last 11 years. When you renew your yearly membership in Eshoes, please select the "Renew" button and if you are a new member, choose the "join" button. There are a number of duplicates in eshoes. Contact Rhonda if you have any questions.

There were several late entries into the state tournaments again this year. Please be aware of the date that the form must be received by. **No call-in entries will be accepted next year.**

State pins are available for \$3 each. These are nice to give to your competitors at the world tournament or if you are traveling out of state to different tournaments. State polo shirts are available with your name on them. See Rhonda for an order form.

Game related sales inventory will not be replenished. We are going to sell off what we have. The current inventory list is being published in the Shoes News.

Need new club information for website. Wait until after your club elections. Contact Rhonda for any updates. The tournament reconciliation form is available on our wshpa.com website under "schedule". We will continue to use the website for the state singles/doubles sign up forms. We will get the class information out on the website as soon as they are available. In regard to social media for horseshoes, please verify information before posting.

Vic Magnus is the interim Regional Director. Curtis Lee has stepped down. If you did not complete your court sanctioning forms this year, please do so and send them to Vic Magnus.

Curt sent the forms to tournament directors earlier this year. Vic asked if anyone has done their court sanctioning, please contact him. Courts need to be re-sanctioned every 4 years. He also added that Kennewick will be getting a face lift in time for the world tournament.

If you are being charged to use your own courts at the parks, a recommendation was made to take a pro-active approach to try and eliminate the fee charged. Contact your parks department and city officials.

Other discussions included:

Moving the state singles tournament from Labor Day weekend. Moving the state doubles tournament to a Sunday following a Saturday tournament during the regular season.

Some Arizona tournaments have handicaps if the percentage spread is more than 10%.

Pay score keepers \$1 per game instead of \$.50

Encourage more car pooling and moving start time to 10 or 11 AM.

Opening your home to those who travel long distances for tournaments

Suggest those who do not have a club, join one or start their own so they can have a vote at the executive board.

Gene Lindbo would like to see the state singles tournament moved to sometime other than Labor Day weekend. Labor Day weekend is family time. In Arizona, they split their state singles and doubles to different times of the year. Per Gene, Arizona publishes the tournament results via email as soon as their tournament is over. They don't have a Shoes News publication. Note: Eshoe posts all tournament results as soon as they are submitted.

In Arizona if the percentage spread is more than 10%, they handicap. It makes for a more even playing field.

Would like to see scorekeepers get paid \$1 per game instead of 50 cents.

Barry noted that we have not changed our rules to change with the times. Encourage others to carpool. Also, start the tournament later, so you don't have to come on Friday night to be available for a Saturday tournament. Idea, start tournament at 11 am, so the drive can be made easily on Saturday morning. Think about opening up your home to those who travel to tournaments near you.

Those who don't belong to a club, how do they get a vote at executive board. Suggestion was to join an existing club or start your own club.

Create a survey for members to get input into executive board for suggested changes.

Goal is to get 50% new members due to the world tournament being held in Washington this coming year. Everyone needs to get in 4 tournaments to be eligible for the world tournament. Think about making your one day tournaments into two-day tournaments.

President, currently held by Jon Martin. Nominees were Don Davis. Don was elected to that office. Jon thanked everyone for the support he was given as he served as our president.

Thank you to the Olympia club for hosting this year's state tournaments. They did a great job! Banquet was great. Bid on location of the 2024 state singles and doubles: Burlington/Skagit. There were no other interested clubs.

The state singles will be held in Burlington Labor Day weekend 2024.

The state doubles 2024 will be held in combination with another tournament.
