**W**here did summer go? September! In September the days get shorter and summer ends! September! 2008 champions will have been named, horseshoes will be winding down, the woodshed needs to be full.

But thankfully, there are still meaningful, exciting year end venues ahead for pitchers. The Northwest Open in Yakima is a classic tournament where the best horseshoe pitchers in the Northwest meet and compete. It is fitting that this classic tournament is held on the courts where World Champion John Monasmith honed his game.

The Northwest Warmup, and Kitsap precedes it, and then Olympia, Spokane, Odessa and Seattle. In a new venue that is becoming bigger, better and more fun every year is the Year ending Turkey Shoot in Goldendale. The courts and club at Goldendale were a product of grant money that the National Horseshoe Pitchers Foundation provides in its mission of expanding horseshoes. The grant money was used to outfit the club and now local merchants provide turkeys as prizes. The day starts with biscuits and gravy in the morning and roast turkey at a noon break with apple and pumpkin pie. The turkey is roasted on the grounds.

Avid horseshoe pitchers wonder why everyone doesn't pitch horseshoes. We can all agree that it's not for everyone, but there are more someone's out there who would pitch if we could find a way to reach out to them, introduce them to our game and our people. We have a unique tool that we don't use as much as we should and there is a blueprint on the NHPA website called the "pitch and win" program. World Champion Don Titcomb, created this program for county fairs and special events. At the state meeting, we need to fund the 'publicity and

### WA STATE DOUBLES – 2008


It was sunny, it was warm, it was cloudy, it was windy, it was cold, it was blustery, it was rainy – it downpoured!

Well here is a World Tournament story for you. I left here on Wed. July 2 at 0030am. I was driving with my two younger children with me. Went through WA, Id, Mont, NDak, Minn, and stopped and visited my nephew in Wis. Then was traveling again through Ill, In, OH, and Penns. Well when we arrived in Penns. we broke down and was on the side of the road for a little while and then I got vehicle started again and found a Plaza (rest area). Spent some time at rest area. Called friend to meet with him OK no problem headed to Scranton, Penn. After visiting with him for a couple of hours was ready to continue my trip to the East Coast due to having family there. Then was traveling again through NY, Conn, and came into Mass and broke down again. Called cousins in Maine and the came to where I was at and wouldn't you know my vehicle started right up again so they followed me to Maine and then I followed them to their house. Arriving at 130am, Monday. Well we found places to sleep and crashed until about 1000am. Well went out and visited with family which was wonderful for the girls to be able to meet family for the first time. Found the Presidents summer house, stuck feet in the Atlantic Ocean, and tried some clam cakes. Took vehicle to mechanic on Tues so was visiting with more family members. Diagnostic done and nothing showed up as to why the vehicle died so left Maine on Wed. and was heading now to Maryland to pick up my sons things from when he was back east working. Well we get back into traffic and traveled through NH, and Mass, there was a storm and then cleared up well while clearing up my vehicle died in the center lane and so I had to get towed out of lane and ended up staying in Mass for the night. Tow company did a diagnostic in the morning and could not find anything wrong so I was on my way again. Headed through Conn, NJ, Del, Maryland and this time I died in the Maryland Harbor tunnel 100feet from the end of tunnel. No one would help to push me out so the state workers came to my rescue and pushed me to the side of the road. Sat on side of the road for 1hr 45 min. Then vehicle started with no problem and made it to exit 4 and died again so I sat another 45 minutes and started up again and went into gas station and rested for 2 hrs. Well called person who had my sons things and he met us at 711 at 630am. Well he couldn't find anything so suggested that I go to service station and have regular mechanic look at. Sat for 2hrs waiting for mechanic to show up. He did diagnostic and could not find anything wrong with my vehicle so he suggests to go to the dealership which is right up the street. So went to dealership spoke to service department and explained everything to them and they said would do diagnostic to see what is wrong. So while vehicle is in the shop I am looking at other vehicles to replace what I have. While looking diagnostic is finished and they can not figure anything out that is wrong so I decided I wanted to be safe and not on the side of the road any more I chose a 2005 trailblazer to replace my 2002 blazer. So after this I head back to Penn so that I can pitch in tournament on time. So this is my adventure to World Tournament and after World tournament I headed for home and made it with no problems. Arrived home on Sun 20th at 630am. So here is another World tournament story for you. Have a great day. Bonnie Lewis

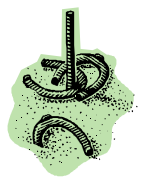

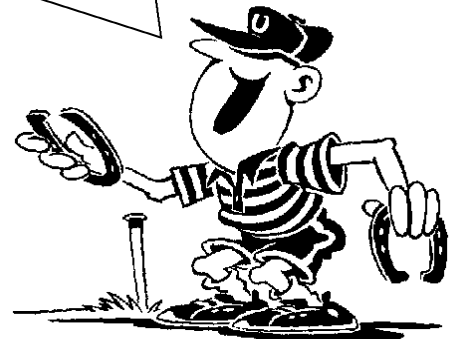

promotion’ line item in our budget, appoint a committee who can trail our HOF trailer to county fairs, and conduct a new “Pitch and Win” program. There are enough retired persons in our membership and funds in the treasuries of the WSHPA and charters to fund a few days at a fair to conduct this program. I’m certain that if the trailer were set up as a booth at a county fair, horseshoes and game related items could be sold as well.

In an interesting tidbit, at Goldendale a number of picnic horseshoes were left at the courts for use by a bicycle club that was camping overnight in the park. Several days after they’d left, going back to gather the shoes, not surprisingly, they were gone.

In another surprise, in an unscheduled later visit to the courts, several young people were pitching with the lost shoes. The shoes were left with them and an offer to meet with them the following Tuesday.

I am going to leave shoes at the courts with a sign that they are donated by the Goldendale Horseshoe Pitching Club. Will they be there permanently? Probably not, but it’s an experiment in how we might attract youngsters to our game. I’ll have a report at State.
