Rule Change by NHPA

RULE 1 – PITCHING DIVISIONS

Section A - Juniors (See REQUIREMENT 6, for exceptions and additional information)

1. Junior Cadets (any pitcher nine (9) years old or younger for the entire calendar year).

New Rule: (note: this Rule change would not normally go into effect until January 1, 2013)


RULE 1 – PITCHING DIVISIONS

Section A - Juniors (See REOUIREMENT 6, for exceptions and additional information)

1. Junior Cadets (any pitcher twelve (12) years old or younger for the entire calendar year).

Explanation and Ruling :

With the recent delegate vote and age change for Junior Cadets, at the Knoxville Convention (changed from age 9 to age 12), these young boys and girls will now be allowed to pitch in the Junior Cadet Division, so long as they remain 12 years of age for the entire calendar year. For those Cadets who may have already moved to the Junior Boy/Girl Divisions (and are currently age 10, 11, or 12 years of age), they will be allowed (but not required) to move back to the Junior Cadets Division, but cannot make this change before October of this year (also, after the 2012 State Tournament), and upon their purchase and possession of a 2013 NHPA card. This decision was made by a vote of the NHPA Council. Please note that pitchers moving from Juniors back to Cadets will also need to re-qualify at this new, shorter distance (see Rule 11, Section D.1) before pitching in an NHPA sanctioned tournament.



Ed: Thanks to Jerry Clark for this letter:

I'm sure the stories about how we came to love the sport of horseshoes are as varied as the different personalities in our sport. My first exposure to horseshoes was at about 16 or 17 years of age. I had a close friend whose father and brother-in-law were pretty good, so they were always trying to get us to split up and play doubles. Although I enjoyed playing, the thought of making a ringer was going to be pure luck.

After that year, I dropped the game completely until 2007 when my wife and I moved from Mukilteo to Camano Island. We had a much bigger lot on the island, and I told Sue that while we were putting in a back yard, I think I'll put in a couple horseshoe pits.

Then I got on the internet to see if I could teach myself how to play the game. Around this period of time, my brother-in-law, living in Southwest Washington, would have the whole family down to his home every labor day weekend, where we would eat, roast marshmallows over the campfire, do karaoke, and have a doubles horseshoe tournament.

With my newly installed pits, I was getting to be a pretty good picnic horseshoe player. My brother-in-law came up with a trophy and we chose up teams. It got to the point where I could pick the worst pitcher in the whole family and still have a pretty good shot at winning.

Then I decided to see if there were horseshoe leagues in the state. I found out about the WSHPA and found that the nearest club to my home was the Skagit Valley Club in Burlington. In 2009 I finally got up the courage to start practiving with the club on Tuesday evenings. I'll never forget my first night there, watchingall these good pitchers throwing on ringer after ringer, and I wondered if this was a good idea. Margaret Byfield was very nice, and asked me how many ringers I could throw in a hundred shoes. I told her, maybe twenty, but in my mind, I knew it was probably closer to 10 or 15. Not knowing anything about handicapping and therefore not knowing anything about that number next to my name on the score-sheets, I had no idea that I was starting every game with a 20 point lead in a 30 shoe count-all game. I think I won a game that night, and went home feeling good. In the ensueing weeks, I quickly found out that I had a lot to learn about the game.


The sport of competitive horseshoes is a wonderful game. It challenges your skills in many ways. You have to develop your own style of play as well as your own rhythm and pace. The game makes you earn everything you get, and teaches you not to give your opponent any extra chances to beat you. The weather can come into play, as well as all the aches and pains we all experience. Cancellation scoring gives you a chance to hang with an opponent until your game gets flowing, and last but not least there is the mental aspect of the game.

To be good at horseshoes, you must have control of the mental as well as the emotional parts of the game. The game is very challenging and competitive, and at the same time the camaraderie and just plain fun and the enjoyment of playing tops it all. It truly is a gme for all ages and skill levels.

The more my game improves, the greater appreciation I have for the legendary pitchers of Washington State, both past and present. I hope and pray that this great sport will continue on, and that I will be blessed to participate for many years to come.





2. Each charter is highly encouraged to **establish a Promotional Director** to coordinate your charter's promotional activities. Twelve represented charters at this year's meeting already had established promotion Directors. This position is a very key element (*Continued on page 10*)

in membership growth.

3. Advertising is another method discussed. Local "community events" catalogs advertise all sorts of activities. Contact your local Chamber of Commerce, or City Hall and find the right person to get your horseshoe club listed and have a "Introduction to Horseshoe Pitching" night in your local town. It's free of charge and it works !!!!

4. Create a Charter Brochure that lists your basic charter contact information and mission statement. It can be a simple tri-fold print that can be handed out just about anywhere. If you are interested in viewing a good sample, contact me and I'll make sure you get one from. Wisconsin had a beautiful one at the meeting for a sample.

5. New Member Packets can be created for your members, and they just may spread the information you give them to their friends and family. Things that can be included are: RGS book, etiquette and dress code information, state brochures, NHPF info, GRS info, tournament schedule, etc... almost all this information is available on the NHPA website. 6. Have **business cards** for all your officers to hand out.

7. Run a "Pitch and Win " event at a local county fair or similar event. These events create awareness of your local charter and can be a very effective method to recruit members. Complete guidelines on how to conduct a "Pitch and Win" event are posted on the NHPA website under the "How To" section.

These are some of the promotional ideas that were discussed at the 2012 State Officer's meeting in Knoxville. I hope you discuss these and other techniques....and try some of them. Your charter won't grow by itself, someone needs to push for growth. establishing your communications network is a HUGE first step in growth. Following up with a good promotion program will help you get your charter numbers going in the right direction.

As always, if you have feedback or other suggestions and ideas for promotion, send them to me and I will share them with the entire NHPA CC email network.
